The purpose of our Kindergarten Screening is to meet your child and gain a basic understanding of his/her readiness skills and personality. We make up classes by placing the same number of boys and girls per class and having a range of abilities in each class. Meeting your child helps us with class placement for the upcoming year.

Who does the screening?

The Kindergarten Teachers and the Speech/Language Pathologist.

What does my child have to do?

Your child will be asked to do short, fun tasks, which are related to success in school, such as using playdough, naming colors, listening to a story, answering questions about the story, cutting, writing his/her name, naming letters/numbers and drawing a picture.

The screening is not used to verify if your child is ready for Kindergarten. No child is refused from Kindergarten. Kindergarten is available to all children who are age eligible.

Because of COVID-19 and a lack of food on grocery store shelves, Ashford Food Program would like to offer all residents, who qualify, to fill out an application to join Ashford Food Program.

The program provides only dried or canned foods once a month. Food is distributed on the first Friday of each month. Each month includes items such as canned meats, vegetables, soups, pasta, fruits, etc.

Please be aware applications are subject to income limits of \$35,950.00 (or less) for a single person, or \$41,050.00 (or less) for a couple. Also, the applicant must live in Ashford.

All completed applications should be mailed directly to the Ashford Food Program, 5 Town Hall Road, Ashford, CT 06278. No personal information will be received by anyone involved in the packing or distribution of the food, with the exception of your name and phone number for contact purposes on delivery/pickup times and places.

Announcing Ashford's Pollinator Pathway Project

March 2022

With the support of the Ashford Conservation Commission, and in collaboration with surrounding towns, the Pollinator Pathway project (https://www.pollinator-pathway.org/) encourages residents to get involved in local efforts to save pollinators -- butterflies, bees, hummingbirds – that have been in decline due to habitat loss, fragmentation and pesticide-usage. The Pollinator Pathway project collaborates with local gardeners, land owners, town officials and business owners to promote pollinator-friendly practices such as:

- including native plants on your property (since pollinators prefer these) and managing invasive species
- avoiding the use of pesticides and herbicides
- reducing your lawn size and/or leaving some bare ground and dead wood for nesting native bees (including leaving some autumn leaves for overwintering pollinating insects)

You do not need to be a large land-owner or convert current-use gardens, lawns or fields to all native plants in order to help pollinators. Even small window boxes and native plants left at the edge of pesticide-free fields or lawns are a huge benefit. Please help pollinators survive and thrive by adopting mindful pollinator practices and registering your efforts with Pollinator Pathways. You can help spread the word by ordering a Pollinator Pathway sign for your yard (https://www.pollinator-pathway.org/sign).

Registering your efforts with the Pollinator Pathway website also helps us work with surrounding towns to map contiguous pollinator corridors between land trust sites, town and state gardens/forests and other private properties. Ashford already has large tracts of protected land -- the Natchaug and Nipmuck State Forests, Wolf Den Land Trust, Joshua's Trust, Yale-Myers Forest and numerous non-profit camps — making it an ideal site for healthy, sustainable Pollinator Pathways.

The Ashford Pollinator Pathway Project is a group of volunteer Ashford residents who garden or maintain land with best-pollinator-practices. We can provide information and advice on native plants (including site visits to provide plant identification), invasive species, pesticide usage, lawn reduction and leaf collection. We are working with the Ashford Library to provide free native plant seeds through the Library's existing seedbank. We are partnered with Ashford Garden Club, Joshua Trust, and local businesses on a number of other initiatives, including invasive plant removal and town garden/land tours that feature native plants and best pollinator practices. Ashford Volunteer Fire Department

As the start of daylight-saving time approaches on Sunday, March 13th, AVFD reminds residents to practice this life-saving habit: When you change your clock, remember to change the battery in your smoke alarm.

Your risk of dying in a home fire is cut in half when you have smoke alarms that are working properly. Take the time to protect your family by making sure all smoke alarms in your home are working properly.

According to the NFPA, families have about two minutes to get out of their homes once their smoke alarm sounds due to fire. However, those life-saving minutes only occur when alarms are fully powered and operational. Three out of every five home fire deaths across the nation resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

In addition to changing or checking your smoke alarm battery, here are some helpful preparedness tips:

- Place a smoke alarm on every level of your home outside sleeping areas. If you keep bedroom
 doors shut, place a smoke alarm in each bedroom.
- Test your smoke alarms every month.
- Teach children what the smoke alarm sounds like and what to do when they hear it.
- Prepare and practice an escape plan know at least two ways to get out of a room, crawl low under smoke and plan where to meet outside.
- Keep smoke alarms clean by regularly vacuuming over and around it. Dust and debris can interfere with its operation.
- Install smoke alarms away from windows, doors, or ducts that can interfere with their operation.
- Never remove the battery from or disable a smoke alarm. If your smoke alarm is sounding "nuisance alarms," try locating it further from kitchens or bathrooms.
- Replace batteries at least once a year.





Home Safety Checklist – Bedroom

Do throw rugs create a tripping hazard? Is the carpet torn? If so, remove throw rugs or use double-sided tape (heavy duty tape) or a rug pad to secure the rug to the floor. For small tars, a little glue or carpet staples can fix the problem.

Is the room cluttered with clothing, magazines, newspaper, or other items? Is there too much furniture for the space? If so, it might be a good time to work with your senior and clean out closets and drawers of items he/she no longer wears or uses. For other items, build or buy shelving for closets to store sweaters, blankest or shoes.

Does the senior lack access to a telephone or cell phone, especially at night? If so, consider a cordless phone. If the senior is not agreeable to having a phone in the bedroom, or he/she doesn't own a cell phone, suggest an emergency alert system. An internet search for emergency alert or medical alert systems will provide you with a variety of options.

Is there enough light? If not, nightlights are a good option for dark rooms at night. If the senior likes to read in the bedroom at night or turns on the light in the middle of the night to go to the bathroom, make sure the bulb wattage is high enough to properly illuminate the room. Rope lighting is another good option for hallways that connect the bathroom and bedroom.

There has never been a better time to consider putting solar panels on your home and reducing your electric bill. On January 1, new electric rates for solar went into effect. Now you have more choices, and can get a better rate for the energy you produce. With the Buy-All option, you sell all the energy your system produces back to the power company, without using it to power your home. The Netting option mixes the energy you produce with what you buy from the grid. This table summarizes the two choices for Ashford residents connecting new systems:

	Buy-All	Netting
Rate	\$.2943/kWh, fixed + \$.025/kWh (fixed) ¹	Retail rate (variable) + \$.0318/kWh (fixed) ² + \$.025/kWh (fixed) ³
Payment	Cash	\$.0318/kWh in cash, balance credited to account monthly
When Paid Out	Quarterly	\$.0318/kWh quarterly, balance only paid when account closed
Term	20 years	20 years

Choose the Buy-All option if you want a guaranteed income at a fixed rate that pays out regularly. The Netting rate varies as the retail rate changes, but the additional \$.0318/kWh, the Renewable Energy Credit (REC) is fixed. The \$.025/kWh portion is fixed but is only available if your income is less than 60% of the state median income. Note that the Netting option does not pay out any credited energy until you close the account. The Netting option is better if you will be installing batteries.

In both cases, the maximum size of your system is limited to the lower of 25kWh or your highest monthly consumption in the last 5 years. This is done to avoid overloading the distribution network, to spread the generation around the network. But if you will be converting to electric heat, you can add 3,608 kWh for a whole-home air source heat pump, or 2,458 kWh for a whole-home ground source heat pump. You can increase the system by 3,285 kWh each for up to 2 EV charging stations. If you want to add more panels to an existing system, you must use the Buy-All option. You can learn more by contacting a solar installer or Eversource.
