New Catch and Release Fishing Initiative

You may see some colorful new signs at popular fishing access sites in the northwest part of the Quiet Corner in the next few weeks.

The Thames Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited, with the support of local sportsmen's clubs, are launching a campaign to encourage more catch and release fishing.

Gary Lussier, President of the Thames Valley Chapter of TU, states: "The intent is not to discourage people who like to enjoy a fresh trout now and then (who doesn't?) but to raise awareness of the benefits of catch and release with minimal harm to the fish."

Figures from Andrew Bale of the DEEP show about 120,000 freshwater licenses and permits being issued. This includes about 80,000 trout stamps. Plus who knows how many younger kids who don't need licenses. At the same time the state stocks about

500,000 catchable size trout annually. According to Steve Gerling, coordinator of the project, "Fishing provides a truly great opportunity to enjoy the best of the outdoors But with those numbers it's not hard to see why the lakes and streams can be quickly depleted of trout when many people keep their entire catch at every outing."

He continues, "The main message of the campaign is that more catch and release will yield better fishing for more of the season. Especially in the case of trout, this also increases the possibility of more "holdover" fish and ups the chances for natural reproduction in our lakes and streams. The signs give tips on how to minimize injury to your catch, and will even have a small pair of pliers attached for those who wish to bend down hook barbs at waterside."

Loos & Co. in Pomfret generously supported the project by donating the steel aircraft cable and hardware assembly that will be attached to the needle-nose pliers.

In addition to the Thames Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited, the following clubs added their endorsement and support to the effort: Putnam Fish and Game Club; Pomfret Rod and Gun Club; Eastern CT Sportsman's Club (Ashford); Fin, Fur, and Feather Club (Chaplin); and Stafford Fish and Game Club.

All of these groups ask you to please consider Catch and Release. It makes for better fishing for everyone.



Fellow Citizens of Ashford,

The Proposed Budget for FY22-23 and calculator <u>Ashford Tax Calculator (ashfordtownhall.org)</u> are posted on the Town of Ashford website. The proposed budget increase of 4.67% combined with the recent reassessment of property values will generate a MIL rate of 32.349. The total operating budget for the town, including Ashford School and Region 19 will increase approximately \$700,000 over the prior year budget, to \$15.7 million. Please take the time to see how the higher reassessed property values and proposed MIL rate will impact your tax obligation. We welcome your feedback at the Board of Finance Public Hearing on April 5, 2022.

Important information from the Ashford Registrars of Voters

Lauren Olson / Democratic Colleen DePercio / Republican

May 9, 2022: This is the last day that an enrolled elector can transfer from one party to another and be eligible to vote in the state primary of a new party. (§ 9-59)

August 8, 2022: This is the last day, by 12:00 noon, that an enrolled elector who is registered as an unaffiliated voter can transfer to one of the major parties to be eligible to vote in the state primary of that party. (§ 9-56)

August 9, 2022: If there is to be a primary, the date of the primary will be August 9, 2022.

Kindergarten Screening Thursday, April 28, 2022

The purpose of our Kindergarten Screening is to meet your child and gain a basic understanding of his/her readiness skills and personality. We make up classes by placing the same number of boys and girls per class and having a range of abilities in each class. Meeting your child helps us with class placement for the upcoming year.

Who does the screening?

The Kindergarten Teachers and the Speech/Language Pathologist.

What does my child have to do?

Your child will be asked to do short, fun tasks, which are related to success in school, such as using playdough, naming colors, listening to a story, answering questions about the story, cutting, writing his/her name, naming letters/numbers and drawing a picture.



ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: Steve Gerling

Steve Gerling has been doing relief woodcarving since the mid-1970's. He has a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from UConn, with a major in sculpture. After school, he was drawn to the additional challenges of relief carving. Not only did an object have to be sculpted but it had to be skillfully distorted in scale, perspective, and space to create an image convincing to the viewer.

Traditionally, most relief work was intended as decoration or embellishment to works of architecture or fine cabinetry. Steve chooses to make the carving the primary object. While much of the work were objects of fine woodworking, using them as a utilitarian frame, the main focus of attention has always been the carving.



Scout Owen Gratton from Pomfret is scheduling his Eagle project to begin around April 30. To advance to the rank of Eagle Scout, a project is one of the requirements. Owen lives near the Old Abington Burying Grounds on Route 97. It's kind of a three-pronged project. (1) He is coordinating mowing and doing general yardwork. (2) He is working with Michael Carroll from Rediscovering History to learn about, and help the younger Scouts, clean gravestones. (3) The placement of a stone (it's currently at Mercer Monuments being sandblasted) which will be placed when you enter the cemetery which contains a message thanking Veterans for their service.

As a little aside, the cemetery contains the remains of 62 Revolutionary War veterans. His family usually places flags there before Memorial Day, so this project is kind of a labor of love. The Troop and Cub Scout Pack will provide manpower to help with this worthwhile project.

Cub Scout Activities: As part of the *Duty to Country" adventure, Cub Scouts from Pack 92 were generously hosted by the Willimantic Police Department where they toured the police station, learned about the many tools a police officer carries, saw a K-9 demonstration and even got to sit in the department's SWAT vehicle.

We have officially entered the Spring season!!!

Now that Spring has arrived, folks are getting antsy to do some yard clean up so you may be wondering, can I burn my yard debris? The answer is Yes and No. There are some steps you need to take before you can light that fire like knowing what you can burn and most importantly – You need a Burn Permit!

Open burning is limited to the burning of brush only. Brush is defined as shrubs, vegetation or pruning's, the diameter of which is not greater than three inches at the widest point. **Leaves and grass are not considered brush.**

Open burning is <u>not</u> allowed:

- to clear land prior to construction activities.
- to dispose of construction debris, household trash, or leaves.
- if the Air Quality Index (AQI) is forecasted to be 100 or higher anywhere in the state.
- if the Forest Fire Danger Index is rated High, Very High, or Extreme.*
- if there is an advisory from DEEP of any air pollution episode.
- if directed by any member of the town Fire Marshal's office, Officer of the Fire Department, designated Municipal Official responsible for enforcing the open burning laws and ordinances, or any official of the Health Department or DEEP.

Remember, before you burn, always have a garden hose or pails of water nearby to prevent your fire from getting out of control, and to extinguish your fire when you are done burning.



Ashford Pollinator Pathway News

Hello Ashford! I'm the town coordinator for the Pollinator Pathway PP Initiative, a grass-roots movement to support pollinators -- bees, butterflies and hummingbirds -- by adopting pollinator-friendly practices in our own gardens and property. It encourages using more native plants and reducing both empty lawn spaces and pesticide/fungicide usage. Even a small patch of pesticide-free wildflowers in a window box or left to seed on the edge of fields or lawns is beneficial to pollinators.

Registering your pollinator-friendly gardens and efforts with the regional organization demonstrates your commitment to pollinator-friendly practices and helps us map out Ashford's pollinator pathways. It's also an honors system -- no one will monitor your property or pass judgement on it. Thanks to the Ashford Conservation Commission, we also have free Pollinator Pathway medallions to give you when you register!

I'll be doing a monthly feature about pollinator activities, registered gardens and local partners in town. Numerous public events are already being planned, some in coordination with surrounding towns (events and other information will be posted to our Facebook page). I'll also be introducing you to the volunteers on our town's coordinating committee – myself, Melinda MacDonald and Heather McKelvie – and their registered pollinator gardens. Email if you'd like to join the committee and help plan events.

I've been an Ashford resident since 1994 when I began teaching as a Professor of International Relations at UConn. I was a member of the Board of Education (two years as Chair) and am currently a member

of Ashford Garden Club. My own garden is a woodland shade garden with a mix of cultivars and native plants. It is registered with Pollinator Pathways and as a National Federation of Wildlife habitat. Once the weather is warmer, I'd be happy to give you a tour of my garden and/or provide site/plant advice for your property.

"Save it For a Rainy Day"

For most of us in town, power failures have cost money, been inconvenient, and uncomfortable. Maybe you are considering buying a generator. But did you know that the new Energy Storage Solutions program being run by the Connecticut Green Bank will pay you money towards installing batteries. For example, you can get \$2700 toward a small battery system, and \$5400 if your income falls below 60% of the state median. Financing is available from the Green Bank.

If you are skeptical about a free lunch, well, you are correct. In order to get the up-front money, you have to allow the power grid to use up to 80% of your battery in an automatic passive dispatch to reduce the peak load, which makes the whole grid more reliable for all of us. The power would be drawn from your battery on non-holiday weekdays in June, July, and August. But the 20% remaining if the grid goes down would likely be enough to power your well pump, furnace, and an efficient refrigerator, and some lights, for at least a day. And most of the time, you would have much more than 20%.

In addition to the passive dispatches, you can also be paid to allow the grid to draw on your battery in special situations. This could happen up to 60 times total in June through September, and up to 5 times total in November through March. You can always decline any of these active dispatches. If you allow the maximum active dispatches, you would be paid (not up-front) an additional \$9,150 over a 10-year period, reducing the cost of the battery substantially.

Pairing a battery system with solar panels makes even more sense. Your battery can be charged from the sun, allowing you to ride through a much longer outage, especially if you are frugal. The Storage Solutions program can be used with existing solar as well, but this might require a change to your existing system.

MacDonald Solar Statement

We are quite pleased with our solar panel experience. We had a 48-panel, bleacher-mounted system installed in 2012, opting to own rather than lease, since that gave us the best return and no burdensome lien on our home. Federal and state incentives at the time paid us back about half of the \$54,000 installation cost. We're nearing the end of the anticipated life span of the inverter, so there will be maintenance costs over time, but we don't expect this to be onerous.

Around the same time that we installed the panels, we also installed heat exchangers to use in place of our oil-fired hot air heat as well as an instant-on central hot-water heater so that we could use more of our self-generated energy and less oil. The oil burners remain in both of our buildings as fallback, but we've seldom needed to rely on them. We do supplement with wood heat in our home.

So, over the years, we've seen the panels produce between 60% and 70% of our total consumed energy (i.e., heat, hot water, cooking, and lighting). This means that the system has already covered our original investment. We're now considering batteries for storage to recoup even more of the energy that we produce. This decision will most likely be made in conjunction with the inverter replacement.

In summary, our solar experience has resulted in significant cost savings and enhanced the comfort of our home. We have no regrets.
