The electors and citizens qualified to vote in the Town Meetings in the Town of Ashford, Connecticut, are hereby notified and warned that a Public Informational Hearing and Special Town Meeting will be held on Monday, August 8, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. in the Lower Level Meeting Room of the Town Office Building and virtually via ZOOM.

- 1. Receive information on proposed appropriations utilizing American Rescue Plan Funds as follows:
 - a) Pompey Hollow Park Pickleball/Tennis Court repairs in an amount not to exceed \$25,000

 - c) Knowlton Hall Installation of heat coils and stamped concrete paving of access area to ensure safer access to the building in an amount not to exceed \$40,000

 - g) AVFD replacement and/or addition to the AVFD supply of emergency equipment in an amount not to exceed \$11,500

 - i) Town Office Building interior/exterior lighting upgrades in an amount not to exceed \$36,500
 - j) 2023 School Bus the estimate we received from our supplier not to exceed \$115,000

- k) Electric vehicle charging station in an amount not to exceed \$20,000

- 3. Approval of the conveyance by the Town of Ashford of the former roadbed of Grant Road to Paul E. Belanger and Pamela B. Belanger, Trustees of the Paul E. Belanger Trust, and to accept the conveyance to the Town of the current roadbed of Grant Road from Paul E. Belanger and Pamela B. Belanger, Trustees of the Paul E. Belanger Trust, to reflect the prior relocation of said roadway;
- 4. Approval of the allocation of \$100,000 as recommended by the Board of Finance and the Board of Selectmen, to represent a municipal match of funds to enhance the town's application for \$500,000 in Small Town Economic Assistance Program funding for the reconstruction and paving of Southworth Drive.

August 2022 Conservation Commission News

Langhammer Trail

The Conservation Commission scheduled a work party last month to clean up the trail as we felt it may have suffered from the winter and spring winds plus the new spring growth. As it turned out there was not a lot of debris on the trail. We did clear out some of the growth that was impinging on the trail. The mountain laurel was in bloom and a pileated woodpecker serenaded us as we walked the trail. If any regular walker is tending to the trail, our thanks and appreciation. We encourage you to get out and enjoy the Langhammer Forest as it is an enjoyable walk with different terrain that hooks up to Fenton Ruby Park. Look for the delicately balanced stone creations all along the Langhammer Trail.

Farmers Market

Our market is doing well this year as more and more produce is coming to fruition each week. Our fruit vendor, Dee Ethier, is now coming to the market with her seasonal fruits and also sells corn. Many of our vendors have been part of the market for several years. The market runs every Sunday from 10am-1pm across the street from the town offices on RT 44. Melissa McDonough, social/youth services director and homelessness liaison, was able to secure a grant so that eligible families will be able to purchase food at the market this year.

Waste Reduction

The Conservation Commission will have a table at the Tuesday summer concert July 26th to educate residents about recycling, reducing waste and the issues with plastic. In addition to harming our environment the town pays a large amount to have our trash removed from the transfer station. Look for our table at the summer concerts series and chat with us about ways to reduce waste.

Conservation Commission meeting are the 4th Monday of the month at 7 PM. We are currently a Zoom meeting. All are invited.

Enjoy the summer. After being outside in our beautiful town, make sure to check yourself for ticks as they are very abundant this year.

Ashford Volunteer Fire Department

Summertime is upon us and so is storm season. It's certainly not uncommon to experience occasional thunderstorms, but in recent years, these storms are becoming increasingly stronger, including more occurrences of tornados in our state.





Our last tornado to hit town, many will remember, occurred on July 17, 2018, at Ashford Lake when an EF-0 touched down, causing lots of tree damage and some damage to properties. Two weeks later, another one touched down in Woodstock. In Oct. of the same year, Mansfield experienced an EF-1. Fortunately, no one was injured in any of these storms, but we need to start being more aware of local storm warnings and take them seriously.

A "Severe Thunderstorm" is defined by producing hail 1 inch or greater in diameter, and/or winds equal to or greater than 58 MPH. The National Weather Service will issue appropriate "Watches" and "Warnings" as conditions change. A Watch is defined as the potential for severe weather, while a Warning means <u>it is</u> headed your way. Listening to and heeding watches and warnings are only part of the equation. Check the weather forecast before venturing out on summer activities and plan accordingly.

We are also in the midst of the Atlantic Hurricane season, which runs from June 1st to November 30th every year. For 2022, N.O.A.A. is predicting an above-normal hurricane season. We all know that sometimes weather forecasts are wrong just a couple of days out, never mind months in advance, so we'll see how accurate they were come December 1st.

Some safety points to consider during weather events are:





- During severe weather head for the basement, or center room away from windows. If a tornado is coming
 your way, get in the bathtub or under a sturdy structure (like a work bench). This can help protect you
 from heavy falling debris.
- If you have pets, plan how you will shelter them and where. Turn livestock loose and do not close them up inside a barn. Keep the barn open so, if necessary, they can escape.
- **ALWAYS** stay away from ALL downed wires. Just because it is a cable TV or phone wire, doesn't mean it didn't get energized. Wires fall in piles, and is dangerous until the power company verifies, they are safe.
- Downed trees may be energized as well. If they are anywhere near overhead utilities, wait for the power company to verify they are safe before clearing downed trees. This also applies to guard rails along the road, which could be energized from power lines falling on them.

The call count for July was 11 Fire/Rescue and 27 EMS. Our fiscal year total is 558.

If you have any non-emergency questions or concerns, you may contact Station 20 at (860) 429-9862 from 6AM to Midnight every day, or the Tolland County Fire Mutual Aide Fire Service at (860) 875-2543 24 hours a day, and they will contact an AVFD duty officer for you.







Greetings Ashford and a HUGE THANK YOU to everyone who attended our June 25th Pollinator talk and/or stopped by our table at the Ashford Arts Council Event on July 9th at Westford Hill Distillers. Almost 70 people attended the June 25th talk by Carrie Crompton, Goodwin Master Naturalist, who talked about the 30-year decline of insect populations in the US and Europe, and the devastating changes to an ecosystem that occurs when insects are absent. The good news is that insect populations are resilient, mostly local, and by providing nectar, pollen and foliage for butterfly and moth larvae in our own yards, we can support insects and help reverse their decline.



We had numerous door prizes to give away, including two large baskets filled with pollinator-friendly items, a variety of native plants and gift certificates from Ashford Garden Center and Foster Hill Farm, and free Anise Hyssop seedlings to anyone who did not win a door-prize thanks to Melinda MacDonald's green thumb. Attendees had a chance to receive a free Pollinator Pathway medallion in exchange for pledging to register their gardens with the organization. They also had a chance to sign up for more

information about Ashford Garden Club. Thank you to all donors, the Ashford Conservation Commission, the Ashford Garden Club and to Lou & Margie Chatey for supporting this event.

Our table at the Arts Council's July 9th event had a steady stream of visitors stop by to talk about gardening, pollinators, and take free informational handouts, pollinator stickers, iron-on bee patches, and small plant growing kits. We also had free native seedlings to give away thanks to the agriculture students at UConn's Spring Valley Farm who are growing native plants free to distribute at events like this. We held a raffle for a free night at Henrietta House Bed & Breakfast here in Ashford; Carol Natitus of South Windsor was the winner.
