Fire at the Midway

On Aug. 20th at 11:46PM, we were called to a report of a structure fire at Midway restaurant that 911 was receiving multiple calls for. With our midnight crew just arriving for duty, the first engine tank responded within minutes of the call. When the first truck arrived, heavy fire was showing through the roof of the bar/lounge area and 2 lines were immediately laid and an exterior attack began with the assistance of an offduty Worcester firefighter, who just happen to be returning to his campsite at Brialee, and who made one of the first 911 calls. As more units and mutual aid arrived, plans were set to begin an interior attack of the bar. With the fire concentrated in the roof rafters, the roof had become unstable and the call was made to evacuate the interior crews, and a defensive exterior attack resumed. The bulk of the fire was knocked down within 20 minutes, containing much of the fire to the bar area, but not before the rest of the building sustained significant smoke & water damage.

With the combined efforts of AVFD members and our mutual aid partners – Mansfield, Eastford, Willington #1 & Willington Hill, UConn Tower and Chaplin, we were able to control the fire quickly and prevent the building from being a complete loss and most importantly, no one was hurt! Fire Marshall, Charlie Sweetland, along with the CT State Fire Marshall, determined the fire started when a cigarette was discarded in a plastic receptacle close to the building.



Unfortunately, this is not the first fire Midway has experienced. Back in February of 1980, much of the then, 2-1/2 story building was destroyed by heavy fire. That fire was officially listed as 'undetermined.'

Management has stated they plan to rebuild and we look forward to seeing our local landmark come back to life once again.



The Federal/ State Election will be held on November 8, 2022 from 6:00am-8:00pm.

October 4, 2022: The Registrars of Voters will hold office hours from 10am-12pm to complete the preliminary Voter List.

October 26, 2022: The Registrars of Voters will be open from 10am-12pm for the purpose of making revisions and corrections to the voter list.

November 1, 2022: The final day to register to vote in the November 8, 2022 Federal/ State Election. The Registrars of Voters will hold a registration session from 9am-8pm. Any mail-in applications must be received by the Registrars of Voters, or postmarked by this date. This is also the deadline to register to vote using the Online Voter Registration System. The online voter registration system closes at 11:59pm.

November 7, 2022: The Ashford Registrars of Voters will be holding a limited registration session from 9am-5pm to admit those seeking to vote in the November 8, 2022 Election, whose qualifications as to age, citizenship or residence was attained since the November 1, 2022 deadline.

November 8, 2022: The polls will be open from 6:00am- 8pm at **Knowlton Memorial Town Hall**. Any elector in line by 8:00pm will be permitted to vote. If you miss the deadline to register to vote, you may register and vote at the Town office building, lower level conference room on Election Day from 6am-8pm. You must provide documents to prove your *identification* and *residency* in the Town of Ashford.

Assessment News

PA 490 Forest and Farm Use Classification - Reminders

Persons seeking to classify land under Farm, Forest or Open Space for the first time must file an application by October 31, 2022 with the Assessor. The completed declaration can be mailed, faxed, left in the drop box to the left of the front door of the town office building or brought to the office.

If the application is approved, you will be mailed a Certificate of Classification filed in the Ashford Land Records. The Certificate will be recorded at the end of November but may not be mailed out until January. If your application is denied you will be notified by phone, initially, with a copy of the denied application mailed to you.

Persons seeking to classify land as Forest must also have a complete certified forester's report dated on or before October 1, 2022.

New owners of formerly classified land must file a new application. If you purchased the property after October 1, 2022, the classification remains in effect for the July 2023 and January 2024 tax bills. Your application will not be due until October 31, 2023.

Changes to the original filing (e.g., ownership, use or acreage) must be updated annually on the farm, forest or open space application. Select the Update Application check box at the top of the form.

All of the forms and links to related information are available on the Assessor Documents page: https://ashfordtownhall.org/document-category/assessors-office/. Scroll down until you see the PA 490 heading.

To receive a credit on a motor vehicle tax bill - You must provide the Assessor with two documents:

- 1. <u>Proof of disposal</u>, e.g., if sold, a bill of sale; if totaled, a letter from the insurance company; if repossessed, a letter stating such; if junked, a receipt from the junk yard; if traded in, the bill of sale for the new car showing the car being valued in trade.
- 2. Returned plate receipt from the CT DMV.

A returned plate receipt unaccompanied by any other disposal proof is insufficient to prove the transfer of ownership. 
COIVD-19 Update:





Cadlerock Property

At the public hearing on September 8 the Commission presented our recommendations for the 350 acres jointly owned by Ashford (about 310 acres) and Willington (about 41 acres.) Both towns are working together to write a remediation grant for this large piece of open space. The land has an abundance of water, wetlands, swamp, pond and small streams plus has numerous steep slopes. We recommend using the land for passive recreation and education for our residents such as hiking, walking, birdwatching, snowshoeing, biking, horseback riding etc. The existing unimproved roads can be converted into a trail system conducive to these passive recreational uses. The Nipmuck Trail runs through the property and that trail system could be enhanced and preserved. The existing unimproved roads could be converted into trails without doing any permanent changes to the natural resources. Long term we see a nature/educational center that supports demonstration projects such as native flora, pollinator's gardens, community agriculture, and education regarding invasive species. This requires long term efforts to allow the town and its residents to develop a plan that benefits residents and enhances our town. Ashford could be a destination site that benefits local businesses and brings in tourism.

Ashford Pollinator Pathway News

As the nights are getting cooler & our gardens are transitioning to early fall, the beautiful **Goldenrods** (Solidago) and **Wood Asters** bloom. These late flowering native plants are essential nectar sources for pollinators scrambling to collect pollen before the first frost. If you aren't sure what Goldenrod looks like, just look for the bright splashes of yellow along our roadsides or meadows at this time of year. Similarly, the white flowers of various native asters can be seen blooming in both sun and shade in fields and woodland.



Both plants play important roles supporting pollinators. 20 species of Goldenrods are native to New England and considered a "keystone plant" for native wildlife, serving as a host plant for dozens of butterfly, moth and bee species. Monarch butterflies rely on goldenrod nectar

to fuel their long fall migration south. And many native bee species overwinter in their stems, while songbirds feed on the seed stalks left standing for the winter. Contrary to popular myth, Goldenrod does NOT cause seasonal allergies because its pollen is not dispensed via wind; instead its pollen adheres to the bodies of pollinators who transfer it as they move from flower to flower. It's wind-pollinated plants like ragweed and some native grasses that are responsible for hay fever at this time of year.

Similarly, there are several varieties of native asters, whose color range from white to purple; they can be short and compact or quite tall. The flower heads provide late-season nectar for bees and butterflies, and the plants themselves also host the caterpillars of the Pearl Crescent and Checkerspot butterflies. Their fall seeds provide food for migratory and winter-resident birds. In addition, both Goldenrod and native



Asters are extremely adaptable and grow in a wide range of soil and sun conditions. They also spread easily.

If you are lucky enough to already have these beautiful native plants in your yard, check out the pollinator activity on them on a sunny day. I've seen bumble bees

collecting pollen from my tall Goldenrod on warm days in late October, when nothing else was blooming. I also have a lot of white wood aster in my garden and am happy to share some with you -- just email me at the PP email to arrange (AshfordPollinatorPathways@gmail.com). Leave the Leaves & Stems

According to the Xerces Society, one of the most valuable things you can do to support pollinators at this time of year is to provide them with winter cover in the form of leaves and standing dead plant material. Resist the urge to clean up fallen leaves; lawns actually benefit from a thin layer of leaves. If you must clean them up, opt for raking or leaf vacuuming to capture whole leaves, rather than shredding them with a mower. Make a leaf pile in a corner of your yard where pollinators and chrysalis can shelter over winter.



Also consider leaving the stalks of flowers with pithy stems standing (Purple Giant Hyssop, Swamp Milkweed, Joe Pyeweed, Purple coneflower, Wild Bergamot to name a few). Their stems are habitats for many nesting bees. Leaving the stalks standing through spring also helps migrating birds looking for seed heads.

"That's NOT Cooking With Gas"

Many of us cook with propane, but now there is a better way: Use an Induction Cooktop. Induction Cooktops replace a range's stovetop burner, and use electricity to directly inject heat into the pan, bypassing a burner. They are more efficient because they do not waste heat by heating the burner or the surrounding air, keeping the kitchen cooler. Since there is no combustion, the air in the kitchen is much cleaner. If you power the cooktop with renewable electricity, you will not produce any greenhouse gasses which contribute to climate change. The temperature control is much more responsive than with propane or a standard electric burner, since you don't have to overcome the momentum of heating or cooling the burner. The cooking surface is a flat ceramic plate, and is easy to clean. It does not heat up, so is much safer, and prevents the pan losing heat down through it.

But what about cost? The table below summarizes the cost of operation. The KWh column is the kilowatt hours you would need to put one KWh of heat into the pan, based on the average efficiencies given. The electric costs are based on \$.125/KWh, and the propane cost is computed from 27 KWh/gallon and \$3.70/gallon. So, induction cooking only costs half as much as propane.

	Efficiency %	KWh	Cost
Induction 1	76.25	1.31	\$.164
Electric Coil	63.70	1.57	\$.196
Propane ²	40.00	2.50	\$.34

We recently purchased an induction stovetop online for around \$60.00, and placed it on an insulated board above one of the propane stove's burners. Now we usually use it instead of propane, and enjoy its speed, control, cleanliness, coolness, and economy.

Of course, there are some disadvantages. Induction cooktops only work with pans that are magnetic, and do not work well with pans with a curved bottom. They generally have a cooling fan which can be quite noisy for some. And they require nearly 15 amps on full power.

ASSESSOR'S NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

DECLARING PERSONAL PROPERTY: All persons liable to pay taxes are hereby notified to declare all tangible personal property owned by them on October 1, 2022. Non-residents are required to declare property located in Ashford for any three months preceding October 1, 2022. Failure to declare by November 1, 2022 as required by law will result in a 25% PENALTY assessment.

The Assessor will mail declaration forms to all property owners previously on record. Failure to receive a form does not negate the requirement to declare.

NOTE: Real property and Connecticut registered motor vehicles do not need to be declared. Taxable personal property includes: unregistered motor vehicles, motor vehicles located in Connecticut but registered in another state, horses and ponies, mobile manufactured homes not assessed as real estate, manufacturing machinery and equipment, business furniture and fixtures, farm machinery, farming tools, mechanics tools, electronic data processing equipment, telecommunication equipment, cables, conduits, pipes, poles, business expensed supplies and other property such as billboards, video games, vending machines, leasehold improvements, etc.

<u>VETERANS</u>: Veterans who served for more than ninety days during a time of war or for fewer than 90 days due to disability must have recorded their honorable discharge with the Town Clerk no later than Wednesday, September 28, 2022 in order to receive a minimum \$1,500 assessment exemption. Disabled Veterans need to have filed proof of their VA rating with the Assessor no later than Wednesday, September 28, 2022 to receive an increased exemption. Active Duty Members may be eligible for a veteran's exemption with proof of prior service.

ADDITIONAL VETERANS EXEMPTION: Increased exemptions are available for those who meet necessary income requirements and the above Veterans criteria. An application along with proof of income must be filed with the Assessor biennially. Filings for this year must have been made by October 1, 2022.

<u>ARMED SERVICE MEMBERS</u>: May obtain an exemption on one (1) passenger motor vehicle if proof of active duty service on 10/1/2022 is submitted.

<u>TOTALLY DISABLED</u>: Any person under the age of 65 that has been awarded total disability must apply by January 31, 2023 to receive a \$1,000 assessment exemption. Applicants must furnish proof of award.

<u>FARM MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT</u>: Eligible farmers must file the **notarized** exemption application on or before November 1, 2022. Exemption applications that are not notarized will be rejected.

<u>FARM BUILDINGS</u>: Buildings used exclusively for farming, excluding residences, may be exempted up to a total of \$100,000 assessment. Any property receiving a tax exemption as a dairy farm, orchard or vineyard is not eligible. Applications must be filed by November 1, 2022.

MANUFACTURING MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT installed in a manufacturing facility and used in the manufacturing process may be allowed exemption. Eligible manufacturers must complete and file the MME Exemption Application by November 1, 2022.

<u>NEW COMMERCIAL TRUCKS</u> with a gross vehicle rating in excess of 26,000 lbs. may be eligible for tax exemption eligibility. Applications must be completed and filed with the assessor by November 1, 2022.

<u>LAND CLASSIFICATION</u>: Persons seeking to classify land under Farm, Forest or Open Space, for the first time, must file by October 31, 2022 with the Assessor. Persons seeking to classify as Forest must also have a complete certified foresters report done by October 1st. Only changes to the original filing (ownership, use or acreage) need to be reported annually.


UCONN LEAGUE WELCOMES **DIVERSE NEW MEMBERS**






