LEGAL NOTICE TOWN OF ASHFORD NOTICE AND WARNING November 8, 2022 State Election

The Electors of the Town of Ashford are hereby warned to meet at their respective polling places in said town on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, for the following purposes:

- I. To cast their votes for Governor and Lieutenant Governor, United States Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator, State Representative, Secretary of the State, Treasurer, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Judge of Probate.
- II. To vote on the following question for the approval or disapproval of a proposed AMENDMENT to the Constitution of Connecticut, a vote of "YES" being a vote for approval, and a vote of "NO" being a vote for disapproval:
 - Shall the Constitution of the State be amended to permit the General Assembly to provide for early voting?

The full text of such proposed question with explanatory text, printed in accordance with §2-30a of the General Statutes, is available at the town clerk's office for public distribution.

The vote on the proposed question is taken pursuant to the Constitution of Connecticut.

Notice is hereby given that the location of the polling places is as follows: Knowlton Memorial Hall 25 Pompey Hollow Road, Ashford, CT 06278

Election Day Registration (EDR) will take place in the Selectmen's Conference Room of the Town Office Building from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Voting tabulators will be used. The polls will be opened at six o'clock in the morning (6:00 a.m.) and will remain open until eight o'clock in the evening (8:00 p.m.).

Absentee ballots will be available at the Town Clerk's Office during regular office hours beginning October 7, 2022.

PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL HEARING/SPECIAL TOWN MEETING **MONDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2022, 6:30 P.M.**

The electors and citizens qualified to vote in the Town Meetings in the Town of Ashford, Connecticut, are hereby notified and warned that a Public Informational Hearing and Special Town Meeting will be held on Monday, November 7, 2022 at 6:30 P.M. in the Lower Level Meeting Room of the Town Office Building in person, hybrid and virtually via ZOOM.

- 1. Receive information on proposed adjustments to previously approved appropriations utilizing American Rescue Plan Funds as follows:
 - a) Knowlton Memorial Hall Installation of heat coils and stamped concrete to meet ADA standards \$70,000 (reflecting an upward adjustment of \$30,000)
 - b) Town Office Building Installation of handicap access mechanism to front door of building in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 (reflecting an upward adjustment of \$1,500)
 - c) DPW/Ashford School gasoline dispenser in an amount not to exceed \$35,000 (reflecting an upward adjustment of \$18,000)
 - d) Social Service Department appropriation for family support in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 (reflecting an upward adjustment of \$20,000)
 - e) Town Office Building security implementation in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 (new appropriation request)

Following discussion on the above funding requests, the Special Town Meeting will be called to order for the purpose of acting on:

- 1. Choosing of a moderator for said meeting;
- 2. Approval of the allocation of ARPA funding adjustments. Items (a) thru (e), in the above list will be voted on separately.

It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Leon Gardner and Jack Barclay, two men who, over many years, contributed much of themselves and their expertise to the Town of Ashford.



Leon R. Gardner, Jr.

November 9, 1922 - October 11, 2022

Raised in Ashford, Leon performed many roles within the Town. He served as the town's Sexton for twenty years, held a seat on the Conservation Commission, worked as a voting machine mechanic, worked with the Assessor to keep assessment maps up to date, served as a member of the Ashford Volunteer Fire Department, held various church-related positions, and became a go-to source of Ashford information. In real life Leon worked for the USDA Soil Conservation Service where he finished his career as a planning engineer.

Mr. Gardner and his wife of 72 years, Betty, raised three children – Michael, David and Sharon, who provided him with numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren.



John S. Barclay

March 20, 1940 - October 6, 2022

Ever the passionate conservationist, Jack Barclay contributed much of his expertise to the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Commission (formerly known as the Ashford Conservation Commission) serving on that body from 1986 to his death.

"He was a scientist who believed we have a spiritual obligation to protect natural places and their denizens."

Following his stint with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Jack served as a Professor of Natural Resources Management at UCONN and was the director of its Wildlife Conservation Research Center.

They will be missed.

The Federal/ State Election will be held on November 8, 2022 from 6:00am-8:00pm.

November 1, 2022: The final day to register to vote in the November 8, 2022 Federal/ State Election. The Registrars of Voters will hold a registration session from 9am-8pm. Any mail-in applications must be received by the Registrars of Voters, or postmarked by this date. This is also the deadline to register to vote using the Online Voter Registration System. The online voter registration system closes at 11:59pm.

November 7, 2022: The Ashford Registrars of Voters will be holding a limited registration session from 9am -5pm to admit those seeking to vote in the November 8, 2022 Election, whose qualifications as to age, citizenship or residence were attained since the November 1, 2022 deadline.

November 8, 2022: The polls will be open from 6:00am- 8pm at **Knowlton Memorial Hall**. Any elector in line by 8:00pm will be permitted to vote. If you miss the deadline to register to vote, you may register and vote at the Town office building, in the Selectmen's conference room on Election Day from 6am-8pm. You must provide documents to prove your *identification* and *residency* in the Town of Ashford. **Please note that this is a change from the previous notice from the Registrars.**








Ashford Recognizes World War II Veteran George Celotti

Army Sergeant George Celotti recalls hearing of Pearl Harbor while seeing a movie at Paramount Theatre in New York with his brother Oresto —who was in the Army at the time. They stopped the movie to request all service members report to their bases. He recalls not seeing his brother for years to come. At 18 George was drafted and assigned 1A —which meant he would be drafted quickly. He went to the Grand Army Terminal in New York and then Fort Dix, where he would get his gear and a haircut. He was then sent for training at Camp Claiborne Louisiana where he focused in electrical work. After approximately 15 weeks of training he was sent to Stockton California to get on a ship to Yokohama. During his time in Japan, he moved up in rank to Sergeant and controlled their message center.

Ashford Students Heading to Germany:

From November 8th through 21st, fifteen students and two teachers will be attending school with our partners at the Einstein Gymnasium school in Rheda Wiedenbrück, Germany. Unique to Ashford, this grassroots experience is completely facilitated by Ashford and German teachers. This means the cost to our students is low in an effort to keep the trip attainable for everyone. Together the two schools chose a theme to focus on, this year it is the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal #17 (Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalization the Global Partnership for Sustainable Development). Projects are planned to work towards that particular goal. The group will meet the mayor, visit the German parliaments, do experiments at a German University, and even visit the Berlin Christmas markets. The students from Germany will be visiting our school from May 20th through June 1st. This partnership can only be strengthened by the hiring of a German teacher, significantly increasing interest in the exchange for upcoming years. Our German Teaching Assistant from Einstein-Gymnasium, Katja Baumgartner, is also significantly helping with the planning of the exchange and preparing our students.

Ashford Volunteer Fire Department

November has officially arrived and that usually means, so has heating season. With the rising cost of home heating fuels this year, it's expected that many, if not most residences, will be using supplemental heat sources this year to offset some of those high costs. More home fires occur during the cold winter months than any other time of the year, with 32% of all house fires being caused by space heaters.

We encourage you to follow these important safety tips to keep you and your family safe!

Electric Space Heaters -


- Choose a heater with a thermostat and overheat protection.
- Place the heater on a solid, flat surface.
- Make sure the heater has an auto shut-off to turn the heater off if it tips over.
- Keep children and pets away from the space heater.
- Plug heater directly into wall outlet, <u>NEVER</u> use an extension cord.
- Always turn off and unplug heaters when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Make sure your heating equipment has the label showing that it is listed by UL testing laboratory.

Wood/ Pellet/Coal Burning Stove and Fireplaces –

- Burn only dry, well-seasoned wood.
- Use artificial logs according to manufacturer's recommendations.
- Use only newspaper and kindling wood to start a fire. Never use flammable liquids, such as lighter fluid, kerosene, or gasoline to start a fire.
- Have your chimney cleaned and inspected annually.
- When disposing ashes, allow ashes to cool before disposing in a metal bucket and store outside away from building. *Never* place them in the garage, breezeway, or enclosed patio.

Fuel Burning Space Heaters -

- Always use the proper fuel as specified by the manufacture.
- When refueling, allow the appliance to cool and refuel outside.
- Make sure all fuel-burning equipment is vented to the outside, And be sure the venting for exhaust is kept clear and unobstructed. This includes removal of snow around the outlet to the outside.




No matter what type of heater you're using, remember to always keep and maintain a 3-foot clearance between all heating equipment and anything that can burn. Make sure your smoke alarms are in working order and install carbon monoxide detectors if you don't already have them.

Later this month, watch for our holiday wreath to go up! From Thanksgiving to New Year's Day, our wreath will be lit with red lights. For every fire we have, a red light with be changed to white. For the past 3 years, our holiday wreath brings awareness to fire dangers through the holiday season. Our goal is to remind you of those dangers each time you see a white light, which is why each year, we ask you to help us keep our wreath RED throughout the season.

The call count for Sept. was 16 Fire/Rescue and 35 EMS. Our fiscal year total is 172.

The Coverts Project: One Family's Experience & a Special Woodland Walk Invitation!

When you go from owning a seventh of an acre and mowing your lawn, and your neighbor's, in about 20 minutes, what do you do when you suddenly are responsible for your new property of 130 acres, mostly woodland? Well, we found out - you find every possible woodland management group and people who can help you learn how to be stewards of your new property.

John and I were fortunate to have purchased land (and by the way a house) in 1997 here in Ashford. We spent the first few years getting the house designed and built so we could live comfortably on our new land. However, we were always seeking help in understanding the care needed for our woodland and other parts of the property. We were contacted by forest land owners who invited us for a woodland walk that was sponsored by Eastern Connecticut Forest Land Owners Association (ECFLA). As we became immersed in the programs and walks ECFLA sponsored, we made contacts with many different people who own, work, or are passionate about the forests of eastern Connecticut. Along the way, we were introduced to the Coverts project to which we applied. As graduates of the Coverts Class of 2000, we were still really neophytes when it came to managing the forest.

Coverts is an intense study of habitat in the woodlands of Connecticut. Participants are educated on the different species of trees, how to identify them, what the best way is to manage for specific animal and bird habitat, and how to manage invasive plants and insects. We learned invasive plants are detrimental to the health of wildlife since, although they provide food for the birds particularly, it is not as nutritious as native plants.

Twenty-two years later, we have gained a greater understanding of the management of the forest, but had become a bit complacent in its management due to working with our daycare business. Although, we have had two management plans and at least three timber harvests on the land, we felt it was time for a refresher. I was fortunate enough to be accepted into the Coverts class of 2022.

In the Coverts class we spent time talking about the infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer and the effect it has had on the ash trees here in eastern Connecticut. Additionally, we learned a great deal about the history of Connecticut forests and their habitat. We spent time with several wildlife biologists who spoke about threats to biodiversity and habitat management. A forest owner is able to manage the forest to encourage the kind of wildlife in which they are interested. The resources available to woodland owners and/or managers are varied and widely available if one knows the best place to start.

In the eastern part of the state, we have a CT district forester who is willing to visit property with the owners and to walk their land making observations and suggestions about the health of the forest. We have had the privilege of working with Frank Cervo, the district forester, and his predecessor, both of whom have helped us make decisions about the forest. We have also worked with two independent foresters who helped us with the timber harvests. When we have harvested timber it has been to improve certain stands within the forest in order to raise up quality saw timber. By thinning inferior stems, we have been able to see healthy growth of quality timber as well as providing us firewood. We heat almost exclusively with wood and go through a significant amount of wood each year.

In our zeal to share some of our knowledge, we are hosting a woodland walk with Frank Cervo, the CT district forester, and Tom Worthley, the UConn extension forester, on Sunday afternoon, November 13th at 1 p.m. at the Leavitts', 194 Old Town Rd., Ashford. 



We are proud to announce that Ashford has received the Bronze designation from SolSmart!

SolSmart is a national program led by the Interstate Renewable Energy Council (IREC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA) and funded by the U.S. Department of Energy Solar Energy Technologies Office. The purpose of SolSmart is to make it faster, easier, and more affordable for homes and businesses to go solar. As a SolSmart designee, Ashford's goal is to help reduce the cost of solar installations which will allow more local homes and businesses to obtain affordable, clean, and reliable electricity through solar while regulating their placement and size for safety.

To receive the Bronze designation the Ashford Clean Energy Task Force was required to complete a Solar Statement and have it approved by a town official, complete a solar permitting checklist to insure there are no unnecessary roadblocks to obtaining a solar permit, and complete a solar zoning regulations review. Ashford's Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) authorized the Task Force to review the current zoning regulations and make recommendations on updating them.

At the July 11, 2022 meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Clean Energy Task Force presented a draft of proposed new solar zoning regulations to the Commission for its review. The Task Force used model solar regulations from other states and towns, along with best practice suggestions from SolSmart, to draft solar regulations that would fit the needs of our town.

Ashford has previously been commended for using solar panels on selected town owned buildings. This is a good beginning toward making Ashford solar-friendly in the continuing need for energy sustainability.
