Greetings to the Ashford Community From Cynthia Ford, Superintendent:

Budget crunch time is upon us. What are some of the requests that the Board of Education has? Preserve the staff we have. Why? One of the most important aspects of a student's ability to learn is the relationships they form while they are at school. Kids have to want to come to school. Not only are these individuals part of the educational aspect of our programming, but nothing beats human connection. According to the longest scientific study of happiness completed by a professor of psychiatry at Harvard Medical School, Dr. Robert Waldinger, "good relationships keep us happier and healthier. Period." This study has followed a group of people since 1938. Strong relationships stand out to make the biggest impact on mental and physical health along with longevity. The people that work at Ashford School make relationships with our kids, they make a difference in the lives of our children. Ashford School is known for looking at all of our students as individuals and we meet them where they are. Personally, I can't put a price on that. We currently have 44 certified staff, 22 para professionals(13.5 are special education), 5 custodians, 10 transportation staff, 4 cafeteria workers, 6 office support and 4 administrators. That is a total of 95 adults present to make those connections. Out of the 22 paras there are 2 preschool paras, 3 kindergarten paras, one reading para, one library para (we currently do not have a library media specialist), and one technology para. These regular education paras not only fulfill their roles but serve as substitutes throughout the year. If you pass the school you will see an ad for subs. Many schools have had to cancel school due to not having enough staff to cover classes. Another request is to add a full time reading interventionist in our grades 5-8. Why? To regain our learning loss and increase our test scores from 68 Performance Index(goal for state is 75) in reading. Pre-COVID, Ashford's Index Score was 70.3. The reading interventionist would work with our students not only on the lower end but also to work with kids that need the extension to learning. This upcoming year we plan on purchasing new programming in reading for grades k-6 through our COVID ESSER funds that remain. Having more boots on the ground to assist in implementing these programs with fidelity is important. The last current request is a .45 school psychologist. A good quote from Fredderick Douglas: "It is easier to build strong children than to repair broken adults." If we were to get a part-time school psychologist we could reduce our outsourced psychologist line to \$7,000. This would be a \$15,000 offset towards the school psychologist. Our increase currently is 3.61% increase.

Building Update: Our generator has been covered by insurance. We are working with the Towns Capital Project Committee to plan some upgrades on the generator. We would like to have an automatic switch installed. The generator will automatically start up if we lose power and will switch back over to the power once it is restored.

The next step for the roof project is to get bids for an architect to design the roof. We will be looking for three bids, the bid process is very specific and we need to ensure we are following all the state guidelines. The building committee will also be working on gathering all the information and documentation needed to apply for the state grant, which is up to a 65% reimbursement rate.

We continue to be tested for lead in our water every month and continue to pass.

April 2023 Conservation Commission News

Waste Reduction

The Conservation Commission is concerned about the amount of waste generated by our residents. Please be mindful of the waste you generate.

We are planning to have another roadside cleanup on Sunday April 23, the day after Earth Day. We will have bags and vests available at Knowlton Memorial Hall from 8:45am-9am on April 23. Ian Preston, Preston Family Property Maintenance, is again offering to help us with cleanup day. Ian has been generous with his time for several years during our cleanup days. He and his family are invested in our town and want to keep our town free of trash. Come and meet this civic minded family and support their business as they support Ashford. You can chose a road to clean or we can assign one to you. Be part of the solution and show up on April 23.

Correction regarding Waste reducing tip for March: The last part of the last month tip: Instead of throwing it away ask your neighbors who raise chickens or pigs if they could use your discards, is an error. Fortunately, the Agriculture Commission provided us with the updated information which is included below. Thanks to Luther Brauch and the entire Commission. Further information about food waste and feeding livestock.

At the federal level, the USDA calls the practice "garbage feeding" and discourages it, noting that it can contribute to animal disease. Although they discourage the practice, the USDA has not gone so far as to make it illegal in all states. Instead, it leaves the decision of whether to allow garbage feeding of pigs up to each state to decide for themselves. Connecticut is one of 27 states that does allow garbage feeding of pigs, however the USDA does require swine farmers who garbage feed to be licensed and inspected by the state they reside in.

In Connecticut (in accordance with federal law), all farmers who garbage feed must be licensed with the State. The food waste must be heated to boiling point and cooked for 30 minutes. The State inspects the farm to ensure that adequate cooking facilities exist and are being used. Full details are provided in the Connecticut General Statute 22-320b.

Ashford does not currently have any farms that are licensed to accept food waste as feed for livestock. As many farms focus on organic, humane, and regenerative certifications, they must be very careful about selecting their husbandry and feeding practices. We encourage residents to build relationships with their neighbor farms to better understand their modern farming practices.

Solar Statement

A Dozen Years of Energy Improvements By Susan Eastwood and Tony Paticchio

We put solar photovoltaic (PV) panels on our garage in 2014 as part of our regional Solarize campaign, run by the Ashford Clean Energy Task Force (ACETF) and three other neighboring clean energy groups. We worked with Ross Solar, the company that later organized and installed the Town's three solar PV arrays on the Town Office Building, the Housing Authority apartments, and the Firehouse.

When our oil furnace was dying, in 2011, we replaced it with an in-ground geothermal system, which added air conditioning to our home. That was a great improvement for our allergies! The cost to us after rebates and tax credits, was less than an estimate for central air that we had gotten years before. And NO MORE OIL BILLS!

We love our geothermal but the pumps and fan, with back up electric heat, did cause our electric use to go up. So, our next project was to add solar PV panels to our garage roof. Our house has a Southeast exposure, but a new cedar roof meant that we couldn't put solar panels there. Our garage has a Southern exposure and needed a new asphalt roof, so we sited the project there. We had one large oak tree that would shade a corner of the roof later in the day, but we decided to let the tree stand, and we minimized the loss of sun by using microinverters that each control 2 panels, so that only a small section would shut off when shaded.

The garage roof holds 20 panels, enough to provide about half of our electric use at the time (less now that we have an electric car). We maximized the space by paying a bit more for the highest efficiency panels available. The installation was quick and trouble free, including trenching the short distance from the garage to the house for the wiring.

Before we could proceed with either of these projects, we were required to have a Home Energy Solutions (HES) audit, which helped to tighten up our home with weatherization and energy efficiency upgrades. These audits can save you a lot of money on heating and electricity by themselves and they will recommend additional work if you choose to do more. In our audit the contractors replaced light bulbs with LEDs, added weather stripping, caulked and foamed drafty spots, and more. On their recommendation, we added insulation to our attic and basement, which made a noticeable difference. You don't see the snow melting off our rather steep Dutch colonial roof because the attic is so well insulated, and we are losing so little heat through our roof! I highly recommend an energy audit to everyone, whether you are thinking about solar, or not. The current cost is \$50.00, with the rest paid for by a small fee on our Eversource bills. Learn more at EnergizeCT.com.

Overall, we are very happy with our solar array and wish we had more! Good luck with your own efforts at making your homes more energy efficient. This is a great time to look into solar and heat pumps because the new Federal and State incentives and credits are very generous. If you have any questions, the ACETF is here to help! 

Leadership Meeting

Review and Commentary

A consensus among those attending the November 16, 2022 Leadership Meeting produced five critical issues to focus on moving forward. The second was, "How to Develop a Strategic Plan –Future Change for the Town".

There was discussion that the **Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD)** that is developed by the Planning and Zoning Commission has in fact and could continue in the future to be the prime documentation of a Strategic Plan, as it represents a ten year vision of the Town. The main body of the 2015 POCD is divided into the following nine subject areas: Governance, Public Safety and Health, Education, Economic Development, Housing, Agriculture, Natural Resources, Historic Resources, and Energy. The 2015 POCD assessed the current state of the Town in relation to those topics, identifying key issues, developing a Vision for each, and proposing objectives and action items to be carried out within a 10-year timeframe.

The group discussed that critical to the process of developing the Strategic Plan and/or updating the POCD is establishing a Communication Plan to fully engage all stakeholders in town-not only board and commissions and town leaders, but also civic organizations, non-profits, churches, businesses, and the general public. It is critical to receive input from all to create a realistic road map for the future betterment of the town. In that way consensus can be reached on ranking the priorities of the town and establishing the short and long term needs as well.

The remaining issues from the Leadership Meeting will be addressed in coming issues of the *Ashford Citizen*.







Ashford Volunteer Fire Department

Warmer weather is synonymous with an increase in outdoor grilling and gatherings around outdoor fire pits. As expected, there is an inherent risk associated with open fires and outdoor cooking. A clean grill is one of the best ways to prevent dangerous fires. Statistics show that grilling causes nearly 9,000 home fires each year, and it is a dirty grill that is to blame for 20% of them. Keeping your grill at least 10 feet from



anything flammable, including your home, is a great way to prevent a grill fire from becoming a home structure fire.



The necessary safety guidelines for an outdoor fire pit are much the same as for a grill, but there are a few other safety tips to consider when preparing to toast marshmallows. Before you build your fire, fill a bucket with water and set it next to the pit in case there is an emergency, as well as to extinguish the fire when you are finished with it. Keep in mind that children are drawn to the outdoor fire, especially with the promise of toasted marshmallows. Keep a close eye on them when they are near the fire and never leave young children unattended near a fire in the pit.



Assessment News

During the month of April, the Assessor's office will be closed April 14th, 21st, 26th & 28th. The office will also be closed on April 11th to attend an assessment workshop.

To receive a credit on a motor vehicle tax bill - You must provide the Assessor with two documents:

- 1) <u>Proof of disposal</u>, e.g., if sold, a bill of sale; if totaled, a letter from the insurance company; if repossessed, a letter stating such; if junked, a receipt from the junk yard; if traded in, the bill of sale for the new car showing the car being valued in trade.
- 2) Returned plate receipt from the CT DMV.

A returned plate receipt unaccompanied by any other disposal proof is insufficient to prove the transfer of ownership. Only vehicles on the 2021 and 2022 Grand Lists are eligible for credits.

<u>Elderly and Totally Disabled Homeowner Tax Relief Program -</u> Connecticut law provides for tax relief for certain homeowners. Credits (reductions in taxes) are determined as a percentage of taxes and range from \$150 - \$1,250. To be eligible for the abatement on the 2022 Grand List:

- 1) You, or your spouse, must have been at least 65 years of age as of December 31, 2022; or you must be permanently and totally disabled (per Social Security or VA).
- 2) You must reside as the owner, or have life use, of the property as of October 1, 2022, and you must have lived in Connecticut for at least one year.
- 3) Your 2022 income cannot exceed \$49,100 if you are married or \$40,300 if you are unmarried. Qualifying income is defined as taxable income for IRS purposes AND non-taxable income, with limited exceptions.
- 4) You must provide the assessor with a copy of your SSA 1099 and your 2022 federal income tax return if you file one. If you do not file a tax return, proof of all 2022 income must be provided.

Applications are filed with the Assessor biennially from February 1st - May 15th. <u>Persons already</u> <u>enrolled in the program were mailed an application at the end of January 2023.</u> New applicants can download an application from the Assessor's page of the town's website at <u>www.ashfordtownhall.org</u>. 



Happy Spring Ashford! With spring comes renewed efforts by Ashford Pollinator Pathways (PP) to encourage gardeners and land-owners to include native plants for pollinators and wildlife while reducing lawn sizes and avoiding the use of pesticides. PP began in Wilton, CT with volunteers from town conservation organizations working together to establish pollinator-friendly habitat and food sources. Email us (AshfordPollinatorPathways@gmail.com) with questions, if you'd like site/plant advice, a list of native plant nurseries, to visit a native plant garden or to get involved. Also let us know if you register your land with Pollinator Pathways so we can drop off a free medallion courtesy of the Ashford Conservation Commission. Can You Resist the Siren Call of Early Spring Cleanup? I find it VERY difficult to resist cleaning up the leaf debris and old flower stalks in my garden on an early spring day. But many pollinators, like bees and butterflies, overwinter in dead plant material and by removing it too early we risk destroying many of these pollinators. Some bees don't emerge until late May, so the longer we can tolerate a "messy" garden the better for pollinators and other wildlife. A good rule of thumb is to wait until temperatures are consistently about 50 degrees Fahrenheit over several days. This helps protect their habitat until they can safely emerge, thereby ensuring a healthy pollinator population. It also improves your overall garden ecosystem, as decomposing leaf litter is good for the soil and many spring wildflowers need a layer of leaf litter in order to emerge.

Free Native Plant Seeds: As with last year, we have provided native plant seed packets free to Ashford residents and available at Ashford Library as part of their annual Seed Bank. There are 10 different seeds, all the easy-to-grow variety that do not need cold stratification.

Coming Soon: "NO MOW MAY!" Ashford PP is collaborating with young conservationists in Ashford School's third grade to learn about No Mow May and develop ideas on how residents can participate. The idea is to avoid mowing grass for the month of May so that lawn weeds, such as clover, violets and dandelions, can bloom and provide vital spring food for bees emerging from hibernation and birds foraging to feed young. If you really hate the idea of not mowing your entire lawn until June, you could leave patches unmown (perhaps in

your backyard or an unused area behind a shed) or mow the edges of your lawn and leave a few meandering paths down the middle. Even small efforts help pollinators survive & thrive!



Air Fryers

Maybe you have been thinking about buying an air fryer, and would like to know if owning one would make sense for you. An air fryer is basically a mini high temperature electric oven with a strong fan. It cooks foods very quickly, and produces results similar to deep frying. But because you only use a thin coating of oil, you eat much less oil and get more of the food's natural taste and nutrition. French fries are fabulous, as well as fresh garden vegies like zucchini and green beans.

Are they expensive to operate? The table below compares the costs of using both a propane and electric oven with an air fryer for one hour. The oven is a fairly standard 16,000 BTUs, and the air fryer a 1500-watt unit. A gallon of propane produces 91,502 BTU¹ and cost \$3.70 on my last purchase, so it would require .175 gallons for one hour. One BTU contains .000293 KWh², and the Eversource default price is an astonishing \$.365/KWh.

The winner is the air fryer, primarily because it is so much smaller than a full-size oven. If you only need to cook for one or two people, a 2 or 3 quart 1500-watt unit might be sufficient, but you will need to add a quart of capacity for each additional person, with a slightly higher energy cost. You will still need your full-sized oven for Thanksgiving. Because most foods cook much faster in an air fryer, it will run less time, and you will save even more.

If your current oven is propane, it is generating greenhouse gases every time you use it, and probably leaking methane even when you are not. The air in your kitchen and the planet will be cleaner using an air fryer, and you will save money.

But there are a few things to be aware of. Some air fryers have baskets coated with Teflon or PTFE, a PFAS chemical, which can release toxic fumes at the high cooking temperatures. It is best to look for baskets made from stainless steel, and avoid plastic housings as well.
