TOWN OF ASHFORD ANNUAL BUDGET MEETING ADJOURNED TO REFERENDUM TUESDAY, MAY 2, 2023 6:00 A.M. TO 8:00 P.M.

The electors and citizens of the Town of Ashford qualified to vote in town meetings pursuant to Section 7-6 of the General Statutes of Connecticut are hereby notified and warned that the Annual Budget Meeting has been adjourned to referendum. The referendum will be held on Tuesday, May 2, 2023 from 6:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. to vote by voting tabulator on the following questions at Knowlton Memorial Hall, 25 Pompey Hollow Road (Rte. 44), Ashford, Connecticut.

QUESTION ONE

Shall the Town of Ashford appropriate the sum of \$3,839,250 for the General Government budget, and \$2,189,042 for the Capital Improvement budgets of the Town of Ashford for the fiscal year 2023-2024, the total appropriation being \$6,028,292; and

QUESTION TWO

Shall the sum of \$23,603,830, the Town of Ashford's share of which is \$3,680,487, be appropriated for the operation and maintenance of the Regional District Number 19 Public School System for the July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024 fiscal year.

OUESTION THREE

Shall the Town of Ashford appropriate the sum of \$8,578,536 for the Ashford Board of Education budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024.

Absentee ballots will be available from the Town Clerk's Office during regular office hours and will become available on Wednesday, April 19, 2023.

From the Editor:

I regret to announce that after many years of working on *The Ashford Citizen*, I am stepping down as editor. It is time for me to put my energy into other projects, and it is time for the town newsletter to move out of the Town Clerk's Office. To put speculation to rest, recent events in town and comments on social media have forced this decision for the sake of protecting the Office. Unfortunately, the Town Clerk's Office's long and successful relationship with the Citizen is a casualty of our litigious and divisive social environment. After this issue, the Citizen will be produced under the auspices of the Selectmen's Office.

This is a good opportunity to give a little perspective on what the *Citizen* is, and is not. People who are new to town may not understand the true nature and purpose of our historic newsletter. A brief summary looks like this:

- 1. The birth of the *Citizen* in 1952. It was staffed by volunteers and financed by donations, advertising and fundraising. The format was a small cut-and-pasted booklet of a folded page produced twice a month.
- 2. The *Citizen* grew to 500 copies by 1996. Volunteers contributed content, and copies were made in Town offices and stacked in paper boxes. We met monthly in the Town Clerk's vault to collate and prepare it for mailing. I think that these were the best days of all.
- 3. Upon Town Clerk Barbara Metsack's retirement in 2013, it became necessary to find a new way of producing the *Citizen*. The computer-driven process meant work could no longer be parceled out to numerous volunteers. Assistant Town Clerk Sherri Mutch became Town Clerk and took over as editor, layout person and coordinator; new Assistant Town Clerk Karen Zulick took over advertisements and subscriptions. Land Use Clerk Beverly Ference continued until her death in 2020 to create and submit transfer and building permit reports, blood drives, interesting facts, and memorials for towns folk who had passed. Publisher was the software used, and submissions primarily came via computer. Printing was moved to a commercial printer in Willington. Issues were mailed to every household, business and post office box.

In order to continue the newsletter, it was agreed to turn over the remaining funds of \$1,000+ to the Town, and we asked the Town for ongoing financial assistance. **Key to understanding the content of the current** *Citizen*: **as the newsletter is largely subsidized by taxpayers, it must remain neutral.** There can be no political content, religious content, or opinion letters, as Taxpayer A should not have to subsidize Taxpayer B's choice of baseball team, church, political party, etc.

4. Today in 2023, 2,045 copies are mailed in town by Every Door Direct Mail, and 27 copies are mailed to subscribers. Sherri and Karen are the total staff; Anything Printed continues as printer and handles the drop to the post office. Issues of 32 pages are produced monthly and include local paid ads, legal notices and updates from town departments, boards and commissions, as well as informational articles from other groups. Legal notices are sometimes published in the Chronicle due to statutory time frames for publishing. There is no staff to do investigative reporting, nor would that fit the nature and mission of our *Citizen*.

Thank you for the many years of friendship and support. I am confident that *The Ashford Citizen* will adapt and endure, as it has so many times in the past.



Taken from the minutes of the ABCD (Ashford Better Community Development) Board, August 15, 1952.

You probably know by now of the action taken at our August meeting relative to publishing a semi-monthly publication to be entitled "The Ashford Citizen". The motion made and carried included the statement that "The Ashford Citizen" be sent to all homes, servicemen, previous residents of Ashford and others interested. The publication will be supported through donations, advertising and other efforts of the ABCD Board whereby they would raise funds. There will be no subscriptions.

The purpose of the publication is to keep Ashford citizens informed on what is going on in town. It is not a money-making scheme, but strictly a community service. Civic events, ads and the calendar of coming events will appear in each issue and other interesting articles will appear when space is available. It is hoped that members of the ABCD Board will furnish brief articles from time to time to be published. Perhaps one article in each issue, or at least one each month, will be possible. The cost of printing each publication will be approximately \$22, including postage. Through the balance in our treasury and any club donations that may be made, the project will be launched. John Bartok will do our printing.

The first issue will reach the citizens around Sept 20. The issues will be dated the first and 15th of each month. The staff will meet at the Babcock Library at the Town Hall the first and third Wednesday of each month at 8:00 PM to address, stamp, tie up and mail the issues. A part of the evening will be set aside for the staff to discuss changes or improvements in the publication, how it is received by the residents, and any other business pertaining to the paper.

"The Ashford Citizen" will be in the form of a four-page booklet 5"x7 ½" (one folded page), and will be as complete as we can make it. If we succeed to support it financially the number of pages can be increased later.

All members have not had the opportunity to discuss this project so there will be ample time to give up your suggestions and criticisms as we go along. You may be sure they will be welcome since launching such a project will be a challenge. It will be a valuable community service – and it should be fun!

The September meeting of the ABCD Board will consist of further discussion on this project. We will appreciate new ideas on ways to raise funds to support the paper. Since the meeting will come before the first copy is printed, there will be an opportunity to raise questions and discuss possible problems involved.

The first meeting of the staff will be held at the library on September 17 at 8:00PM. Thus far, the following have agreed to serve on the staff: Mrs. James Stone-circulation; Mrs. Clarence Sweetland-school news; George Swaykus-sports and ads; Mrs. Frank Cushman-assist in mailing and assembling other material. We will need someone to handle the calendar of events, club and church news and other articles.

To date this is the extent of our progress on this project. I'm sure the publication will be well received by our townspeople. The members present at the August meeting were quite enthusiastic about the paper and hope the other members will help us succeed as a unit.

The Ashford Citizen back in August, 1996:

Today we have tried to follow through with the original idea of "The Ashford Citizen". The format has remained the same. Volunteers still work to put information together to benefit those interested. Donations still arrive to take care of expenses. Printing is done on a copy machine now and mailed bulk rate (no licking stamps). An issue is now published every month to arrive before the 1st of the month listing events for the coming month. Groups of volunteers still get together once a month to collate the pages into booklets, label, staple and sort for mailing.

Today we print 500 copies of "The Ashford Citizen". Copies are mailed to Florida, Washington DC, Virginia, Michigan, Maine, Massachusetts, New York, Illinois, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Arizona, California and many Connecticut towns. In the last year a copy is also being sent to the Connecticut State Library. People can receive "The Ashford Citizen" today, by making a donation you will be placed on the mailing list. Hopefully "The Ashford Citizen" will endure for years to come.

The Ashford Citizen back in July, 2014:

Our little publication has literally become a "big" publication; what was 4 pages in 1952 has grown to 24 pages; the size of the booklet has doubled from a folded-page to a full page. The *Citizen* comes out once a month, instead of twice. The total cost for printing and postage is certainly not \$22 anymore! Lastly, instead of donations, fund-raising, and advertisements, we are funded by a combination of advertisements and town taxes.

From the Selectmen's Office (2014):

This is the first issue of the newly "renovated" *Ashford Citizen*. The *Citizen*, which you will receive monthly, will provide relevant information on available services, upcoming events, town news and what we anticipate will be an introduction to local businesses. On behalf of the Board of Selectmen I would like to thank *The Ashford Citizen* volunteers, past and present, for their hard work and dedication in getting the news to us.

We have all worked very hard to make Ashford a great town in which to reside and raise our families. Much of Ashford's success can be attributed to our tireless volunteers. These volunteers are members of boards and commissions that oversee our children's education and provide emergency services. They develop guidelines regarding land use and decide where our tax dollars are spent. By sharing news relating to Ashford's boards and commissions, we hope to encourage you, our residents, to share in the governing of our town by volunteering to serve alongside your neighbors.

From the Municipal Agent for the Elderly, Kit Eves 860-487-5122

HEALTH FAIR: As municipal agent, I think sponsoring an annual Health Fair for the community, not just for seniors, is an important educational and social event. We were unable to provide the community with a health fair during COVID. However, the Center will be hosting its second health fair on **Saturday, May 13th from 10-1.** Free pizza will be offered at noon. Members of the Commission on Aging are helping with this. We had an excellent turnout for the first fair a couple of years ago. This year, I have invited organizations from a wider range of providers. We should have home care, medical equipment suppliers, veterans' services, retirement planners, hearing impaired providers, hospitals, nursing homes footcare, and assisted living providers. I have a confirmed **COVID Booster Clinic** as well.

FOODSHARE: The Center has been approved to be a delivery site for monthly delivery of food for those who are eligible. This is extra food beyond what SNAP or other food resources you may have. This is in addition to the Wednesday frozen meals we already provide. Eligibility requirements for this program are: You must be 60 years old or older. Income based eligibility is as follows. 1-person monthly income of \$1,473 or less and annual income of \$17,667. 2- persons monthly \$1,984, yearly \$23,803, 3-person \$2,495. Yearly \$29,939. If you have more in your household than three and need to know the scale for eligibility, call me. If you fit the criteria call me for an application. You do not have to live in town but must agree to pick up your food monthly. You do not have to prove your income. This is on the honor system. Please call me if you are eligible.

Assessment News

Elderly or Totally Disabled Homeowners Program - Connecticut law provides for tax relief for certain homeowners. Credits (reductions in taxes) are determined as a percentage of taxes and range from \$150 - \$1,250. To be eligible for the abatement on the 2022 Grand List:

- 1) You, or your spouse, must have been at least 65 years of age as of December 31, 2022; or you must be permanently and totally disabled (per Social Security or VA).
- 2) You must reside as the owner, or have life use, of the property as of October 1, 2022, and you must have lived in Connecticut for at least one year.
- 3) Your 2022 income cannot exceed \$49,100 if you are married or \$40,300 if you are unmarried. Qualifying income is defined as taxable income for IRS purposes AND non-taxable income, with limited exceptions.
- 4) You must provide the assessor with a copy of your SSA 1099 and your 2022 federal income tax return if you file one. If you do not file a tax return, proof of all 2022 income must be provided.

The filing deadline is Monday, May 15th. You must apply in person. Email <u>assessor@ashfordtownhall.org</u> or call 860-487-4403 for questions or to set up an appointment.

To receive a credit on a motor vehicle tax bill - You must provide the Assessor with two documents:

- 1. <u>Proof of disposal</u>, e.g., if sold, a bill of sale; if totaled, a letter from the insurance company; if repossessed, a letter stating such; if junked, a receipt from the junk yard; if traded in, the bill of sale for the new car showing the car being valued in trade.
- Cancelled plate receipt from the CT DMV. Plates can be cancelled using the DMV Online Services at https://portal.ct.gov/DMV/Online-Services/Online-Services. Print a copy of the completed transaction to have for your records.

A cancelled plate receipt unaccompanied by any other disposal proof is insufficient to prove the transfer of ownership. Only vehicles on the 2021 and 2022 Grand Lists are eligible for credits. Please provide the best phone number to reach you on the documentation. You can submit the documents by:

Leadership Meeting Review and Commentary

LEADERSHIP ROUND TABLE PARTICIPANTS DISCUSS ASHFORD HOUSING ISSUES

A town wide Leadership Roundtable was held in November 2022. Accomplishments on the 2015 POCD were discussed along with updates. Participants shared their thoughts on goals and objectives for our town. Five common concerns were identified. The first two focused on; 1) the tax base, and 2) developing a strategic plan. These were summarized in previous issues of the Ashford Citizen.

The third concern centered on how to approach the need for additional Senior and Affordable housing in Ashford. Discussion ensued and several challenges were identified. Seniors have issues with locating housing and with the ability to pay taxes. One or two companies are buying the apartments in town limiting competition. There has been an increase in rental and lease fees. There is a sense that some apartments are not well maintained nor are they senior friendly. Assisting seniors to remain in their homes was a priority.

Thoughts to explore include:

- Researching the need for a Town Planner/Manager. There are cost concerns with this initiative which raise the question if the salary would be worth the benefits.
- Search for federal/state programs that purchase easements from property owners.
- Sharing the use of facilities.
- Mutual living in large homes.
- Cluster housing-sharing open space, forest land & farmland. Would work with Planning and Zoning and other boards on this.
- Creative alternative housing need further input to develop this







Ashford School Third Graders, in collaboration with Ashford Pollinator Pathway, are encouraging everyone to participate in **No Mow May** by not mowing their yards until June as a way to help pollinators. The "weeds" that grow in our lawns – clover, dandelions, violets – bloom before summer flowers and are an important early food source for pollinators & birds feeding on insects.





Melinda Macdonald spoke with third grade students about No Mow May & they had a chance to grow clover for their own lawns. Plastic Recycling - Is it Really Recycled?

Recycling: the process of converting waste materials into new materials and products.

America recycles only about 8.7 % of its plastic waste. The other 90% or so is incinerated or landfilled or ends up in the environment, often on beaches around the world.

What about the triangles with numbers inside? This is the resin ID code of the type of plastic an object is made of. It **does not mean the item is recyclable.** Only plastics #1 and #2 that are bottles or jugs with "acceptable shrink sleeves and labels" and are "not contaminated" are recyclable. Only 18.2% of #1 and 9.4% of #2 plastics are recycled. It is cheaper for industry to produce more new plastic than to devise a way to recycle or repackage.

Companies bear no financial responsibility to clean up the plastic they create after it is used. When they add "green," or "certified plastic neutral" to their products without a program to actually recycle the plastics it is called "**Greenwashing.**" This strategy makes the consumer think that they are taking actions to help the environment. Another strategy they use is to imply that it is up to the customer to take care of their plastic waste by recycling. But as we have seen very little actually gets recycled.

Plastic in the environment kills animals by entanglement and ingestion. Effects on human health are being studied but may include reproductive disorders and cancer.

Ashford's plastic recyclables that are not able to be sold or are contaminated at our local material recovery facility (MRF) in Willimantic are sent to an incinerator.

What you can do to reduce plastic waste!

- Buy drinks in cans (aluminum is recyclable)
- Use reusable cutlery, straws, plates, stirrers and containers
- Ask for cardboard/paper containers for take-out food
- Buy in bulk rather than things that are individually wrapped
- Carry reusable bags, bottles, and utensils with you

Let companies that make your favorite products know that you want more durable, recyclable, renewable, and recycled packaging, and less fossil fuel derived plastic (especially Coca Cola, PepsiCo, and Nestle, the biggest producers of single use plastics.)


