Is the Artificial Grass Greener?

Artificial turf, made of fossil fuel based materials, is a good example of the ways the fossil fuel industry has grown its plastic production as they seek ways to assure that demand for fossil fuels continues as our economy transitions to clean energy.

Right now, the Region 19 Board of Education is researching types of turf because they are faced with the need to replace their aging artificial turf field with another plastic field or return to grass.

Artificial turf is controversial. More and more evidence is emerging about its toxic impacts on the environment and potential to harm human health. A growing number of independent studies have shown that:

- Artificial turf fields, sourced from fossil fuels, cannot generally be recycled and have large carbon footprints. An average synthetic turf field adds up to 40,000 pounds of plastic carpet and up to 400,000 pounds of infill, large amounts of which are not recycled and must be incinerated or sent out of state to landfills.
- Turf and infill degrades over time into microplastics which leach off the fields and enter water resources, impacting drinking water and aquatic life. Tire crumb is estimated to account for close to 30% of the microplastic pollution in the world's oceans.
- Heavy metals and carcinogens are present in synthetic turf and plastic grass. Among these are hormone disrupting chemicals, neurotoxins, immune system disrupters, flame retardants, phthalates, antioxidants, plasticizers, lead, zinc, and cadmium.
- Exposure by users of the fields to these chemicals may occur through inhalation of particulate matter and dust, ingestion of the particles, and by absorption through skin. Once in the body they accumulate in the kidneys and liver. There have been few studies on the long term health implications of exposure.
- Synthetic turf components also contain PFAS, bioaccumulative "forever chemicals" The EPA
 has proposed new PFAS standards for drinking water, identifying PFOA and PFOS as having
 no safe level.

The known and unknown extent of the long term health risks from exposure by players to the chemicals present in all artificial turf, the real environmental impacts, including contamination of soil, water and air, and the serious problem and expense of replacement and disposal every 8-10 years, indicate that artificial turf fields are unsustainable. We should use the "precautionary principle", and focus on a return to well-managed and maintained natural grass using best practices to reduce or eliminate use of pesticides and herbicides. Natural grass fields that are well-managed and maintained may even save costs when calculated over the life of the turf fields.

Town of Ashford Tax Collector

All persons liable to pay taxes in the Town of Ashford are hereby notified that taxes are due on the Grand List of Oct. 1, 2022 on real estate, personal property, and motor vehicles. The taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2023, with a mill rate of 33.085 for real estate and personal property, and 32.46 for motor vehicles. These taxes will be payable without interest through Aug. 1, 2023. (After Aug. 1, 2023, interest will accrue at 1½% per month from the due date of July 1, or a minimum interest charge of \$2.00. Hence, during August, the interest is calculated at 3%, or the minimum of \$2.00, whichever is greater.

Payment may be paid online, deposited in the black drop box next to the front door, postmarked, or in person with check during posted payment hours. Please have your payments prepared. NO CASH.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not invalidate the tax or interest penalty (CGS 12-130).

For the purpose of collecting said tax, I shall be at the Ashford Town Offices as follows:

Mon., Tues., 8:30 A.M. TO 3:00 P.M. Wednesday: 10:00 A.M to 5:30 P.M.

The Office is closed to public on Fridays in order to process mail and online payments.

CLOSED EVERY THURSDAY.

PLEASE have checks made out to the Ashford Tax Collector. INCLUDE one copy of the bill with payment. If a receipt is requested, enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope with payment.

Assessment News

JULY 2023 MOTOR VEHICLE TAX BILLS

If you have disposed of a vehicle since 10/1/2022 and want your July 2023 tax bill to be pro-rated, you must provide **Proof of Disposal** to the Assessor. It's best to provide proof prior to paying your taxes.

Credits and all other changes to motor vehicle assessment and taxes will only be processed on Fridays in July and the 1st week of August, when the Tax Collection and Assessment offices will be closed to the public. The new assessment and tax due will be available in the online lookup on Saturdays (https://www.mytaxbill.org/inet/bill/home.do?town=Ashford).

To receive a credit, you must provide:

- 1) proof of what happened to the vehicle (i.e., Proof of Disposal) and
- 2) a returned plate receipt from the CT DMV. A PLATE RECEIPT ALONE IS INSUFFICIENT
- <u>1.</u> <u>Proof of Disposal</u> depends on what happened to the vehicle. All documents should include the vehicle's VIN and a date.
 - i. Registered in another state: proof is a copy of the registration in that state showing the initial date of registration.
 - ii. Sold: proof is a dated bill of sale
 - iii. Total loss: proof includes a letter from the insurance company indicating the date of loss or a receipt from person hauling the vehicle away for the insurance company.
 - iv. Repossession: proof is a letter or notice from the repossessing company indicating the vehicle's date of repossession
 - v. Junked: proof is a receipt from the hauler or junk yard.
 - vi. Traded-in: proof is the bill of sale or invoice for the new vehicle showing the car being valued in trade.
 - vii. Stolen: proof is a copy of the police report.
- 2. Plates can be cancelled using the DMV Online Services at:

https://portal.ct.gov/DMV/Online-Services/Online-Services.

Print a copy of the completed cancellation as your receipt.

Leadership Meeting Review and Commentary

A consensus among those attending the November 16, 2022 Leadership Meeting produced five critical issues to focus on moving forward. The forth was "Protecting the Town's environment, its history, and our rural character".

What are some of the Challenges?

- Buildings are not as attractive as they could be; how buildings look help make town more appealing
- What is the definition of "Rural Character of the Town"?
- Strip Malls all look different
- The sometimes conflict between the Environment and Development
- Impacts versus benefits
- Rural appearance is also impacted by invasive plant species
- Route 44/74 Corridor is not pedestrian friendly

What are some options to consider?

- Development should be balanced
- Need to consider Architectural Standards for building designs
- Other towns like Simsbury, Farmington, Windsor, Sturbridge have more architecturally pleasing centers
- Investigate the availability of grants to control invasives; maybe starting on town properties
- Should include native species as part of the landscape especially for any new development
- Solar may need to be advertised again as a way to reduce energy dependence
- Can Town establish a Historic District along Route 44/74 to maintain and continue older town feel?

The remaining issues from the Leadership Meeting will be presented in coming issues of the Ashford Citizen.




All Tax Bills that are payable are posted online. The new tax bills will be available on the website on June 30, 2023 and are available for payment if there is a shopping cart next to it. An **e-check** costs \$.95, the credit card fee is 2.99%. If you use a debit card, you must treat it as a credit card, and the 2.99% fee applies. Minimum fee for credit/debit cards is \$3.95. starting 6/19/23. You can use the system 24/7. You do not need to register, but you need to give an email address in order to obtain a receipt. The July 2023 Tax Bills will be available for payment on July 1st.

During July 2023, the office will be closed to the public on Fridays in order to process mail and online payments, and post any adjustments that are necessary.





Ashford Pollinator Pathway News

By Jennifer Sterling-Folker, June 2023

Greetings Ashford! Besides habitat loss & overuse of pesticides, what else is displacing the native plants that pollinators need? INVASIVES!!! Invasives are foreign plants introduced as landscape specimens that escape into the wild and, without the natural mechanisms of their home-range to control them, can quickly out-compete native plants. Many foreign plants are respectful guests in our gardens or have "naturalized" to become wildflowers used by pollinators. But some invasives are dangerous because they spread easily & rapidly, excrete chemicals to inhibit vegetation growth, smother the root system of surrounding plants, & provide little nectar for pollinators. They can take over entire forests as they displace & kill native plants, and getting rid of them is like a combination of "pick your poison + whack a mole." Removing them can be extremely difficult, time-consuming, costly & there are so many of them spreading so rapidly!

Some of the Worst Offenders: Barberry, which spreads along water courses & is a known vector for ticks. Garlic Mustard, which still blooms to produce 1000s of seeds even AFTER its been pulled & put in a black plastic bag for two weeks! Multifloral rose, which forms dense, towering thickets with sharp, nasty thorns. Oriental Bittersweet & Mile-a-Minute, which are capable of killing trees with their twisting, smothering vines. But the invasive that strikes terror in my heart whenever I see a new patch of it along an Ashford roadside is JAPANESE KNOTWEED, considered the "Godzilla" of invasives!



It's similar to Bamboo in that it displaces everything in its path (even other invasives) & is extremely difficult to remove. Its deep taproot & twisting root system make it difficult to dig up, multiple mowings or spraying it with Roundup will

not kill it, & even a small root piece accidently dropped elsewhere will root & grow which means its disposal has to be carefully controlled. The UK takes its spread so seriously that home-buyers cannot obtain mortgages for properties that have unabated Japanese knotweed.

Sadly, the state of CT does little to control the spread of invasives; in fact, its road-work practices help spread them & many invasives are still available for purchase at CT nurseries! There is a CT Invasive Plant Working Group (CIPWG; https://cipwg.uconn.edu/about/) which has work parties for invasive removal, but it's an ad hoc, volunteer group & the task of managing invasive plants is overwhelming. We can help by IDing & clean up invasives on our own properties & abutting roadsides. Use phone apps such as *PlantNet*, *Seek* or *PlantSnap* to easily ID invasives & see info at the CIPWG website on how to remove them.






