- The Citizen is a <u>limited public forum</u> and its limited purpose is to inform the public about news pertaining to local government activities and offer a vehicle for local area organizations and businesses to advertise events, products and services.
- Residents and Ashford taxpayers will receive the Citizen at no charge (every Ashford mailbox and P.O. box). Non-profit groups and taxpayers who live out of town should contact the Citizen to be put on the "no charge" mailing list. All other parties may receive the Citizen for a \$30. annual donation.
- The Citizen will be delivered by the 1st of each month (every Ashford mailbox and P.O. box). Copies of the Citizen will also be made available in the Ashford Town Offices.



THE GETTYSBURG ADDRESS Gettysburg, Pennsylvania

Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before use – that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion – that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain – that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom – and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.

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ASHFORD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT



November has officially arrived and that usually means, so has heating season. With the rising cost of home heating fuels this year, it's expected that many, if not most residences, will be using supplemental heat sources this year to offset some of those high costs. More home fires occur during the cold winter months than any other time of the year, with 32% of all house fires being caused by space heaters.

We encourage you to follow these important safety tips to keep you and your family safe!

Electric Space Heaters -

- Choose a heater with a thermostat and overheat protection.
- Place the heater on a solid, flat surface.
- Make sure the heater has an auto shut-off to turn the heater off if it tips over.
- Keep children and pets away from the space heater
- Plug heater directly into wall outlet, <u>NEVER</u> use an extension cord.
- Always turn off and unplug heaters when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Make sure your heating equipment has the label showing that it is listed by UL testing laboratory.

Wood/ Pellet/Coal Burning Stove and Fireplaces –

- Burn only dry, well-seasoned wood.
- Use artificial logs according to manufacturer's recommendations.
- Use only newspaper and kindling wood to start a fire. Never use flammable liquids, such as lighter fluid, kerosene, or gasoline to start a fire.
- Have your chimney cleaned and inspected annually.
- When disposing ashes, allow ashes to cool before disposing in a metal bucket and store outside away from building. Never place them in the garage, breezeway, or enclosed patio.

Fuel Burning Space Heaters -

- Always use the proper fuel as specified by the manufacture.
- · When refueling, allow the appliance to cool and refuel outside.
- Make sure all fuel-burning equipment is vented to the outside, And be sure the venting for exhaust is kept clear and unobstructed. This includes removal of snow around the outlet to the outside.



No matter what type of heater you're using, remember to always keep and maintain a 3-foot clearance between all heating equipment and anything that can burn. Make sure your smoke alarms are in working order and install carbon monoxide detectors if you don't already have them.

Later this month, watch for our holiday wreath to go up! From Thanksgiving to New Year's Day, our wreath will be lit with red lights. For every fire we have, a red light with be changed to white. For the past 3 years, our holiday wreath brings awareness to fire dangers through the holiday season. Our goal is to remind you of those dangers each time you see a white light, which is why each year, we ask you to help us keep our wreath RED throughout the season.

The call count for Sept. was 11 Fire/Rescue and 31 EMS, Our fiscal year total is 214.

If you have any non-emergency questions or concerns, you may contact Station 20 at (860) 429-9862 from 6AM to 6PM every day, or the Tolland County Fire Mutual Aide Fire Service at (860) 875-2543 24 hours a day, and they will contact an AVFD duty officer for you.



Important information from the Ashford Registrars of Voters

With the upcoming elections **Tuesday**, **November 7**, **2023**, we want to encourage all citizens and residents of Ashford to register to vote!

Voting will take place at Knowlton Memorial Hall at 25 Pompey Hollow Road Ashford from 6:00AM until 8:00PM on Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

** You may register at the Town office building during its regular operating hours Monday through Wednesday and Friday in the Town Clerk's Office during regular business hours. The registrars of voters' office hours are on Wednesday from 9:30 AM until 11:30AM.

Important dates to keep in mind in order to vote for the Tuesday, November 7, 2023:

- ** Monday, November 6 from 9:00AM until 5:00 PM: We will hold a limited special registration session for those seeking to vote in the election whose qualifications as to age, citizenship or residence was attained since October 31st.
- **Tuesday, November 7: Election Day Registration "EDR" will take place at Ashford Town Office Building (5 Town Hall Road, Room 304) until 8:00PM. This change to election law was enacted by the General Assembly in Connecticut Public Act 12-56 "An Act Concerning Voting Rights". This act allows eligible people to register to vote in person and cast a ballot on Election Day if he or she meets eligibility requirements for voting and is either (1) not already an elector or (2) is registered in one municipality but wants to change his or her registration because he or she currently in lives in another municipality. A person is eligible to register and vote if he or she is a U.S. citizen, age 18 years or older, and a bona fide resident of the municipality which he or she applies for admission as an elector. Please plan to arrive early in the day as there may be long lines. *You will need to provide proof of identity and residency*.

CCM Prescription Drug Card Program Get your card today!

The Town of Ashford, through its association with the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities (CCM), the statewide association of towns and cities, wants to remind of you a discount prescription drug card that may possibly help in out of pocket prescription costs.

Since CCM began offering the "CCM Discount Prescription Drug Card) program in September 2012, 141 towns and cities have signed up for the program, Ashford is one of them. During that time, residents in the participating communities have filled over 250,000 prescriptions and saved over \$12 million with an average prescription savings of 50 percent.

The program is FREE to any CCM-member municipality, and can be used by any resident to obtain steep discounts and savings on any prescriptions not covered by insurance, including any prescriptions for your pet that can be filled at a regular retail pharmacy. There are no costs to either the participating municipalities or their residents, and the program is completely anonymous.

This program has helped Connecticut residents save hundreds of dollars on their medication, and certain vision and hearing services, with discounts on eye exams, LASIK procedures, frames and lenses, and hearing aids. Even if you have prescription insurance, this card can help residents save when their current insurance card doesn't cover a medication, or if their pet needs medication that is human-based.

The discount cards are widely accepted at all national chain pharmacies and most local independent pharmacies. Cards can be used by all residents regardless of age, income, or existing health coverage. There are no enrollment fees, membership fees, restrictions or limits on frequesncy of use for residents. Residents can print out a card easily by visiting www.CTRxDiscountCard.com, and selecting the Town of Ashford from the drop-down menu. The website also contains a "Learn the Perks of the Card" section where residents can locate a participating pharmacy, comparison shop their medication, and find the information on the discounts that are also available on vision, hearing, and LASIK services.

TRANSFER STATION NEWS

The restructuring of the Transfer Station and distribution of new window stickers successfully started on October 4th. As of this writing, more than twelve hundred new stickers have been successfully distributed to Ashford residents and property owners.



Armistice Day, as it was proclaimed by Woodrow Wilson in 1919, was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I ("the war to end all wars"), but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history and after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, replaced the word "Armistice" with the word "Veterans." With approval of this act (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

We celebrate America's Veterans and applaud their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
