




On Saturday, November 11, 2023, the Towns of Ashford,

- The Ashford Citizen is a local government sponsored newsletter made possible by town taxes and advertising, and the production efforts of the Citizen Editor.
- The Citizen is a <u>limited public forum</u> and its limited purpose is to inform the public about news pertaining to local government activities and offer a vehicle for local area organizations and businesses to advertise events, products and services.
- Residents and Ashford taxpayers will receive the Citizen at no charge (every Ashford mailbox and P.O. box). Non-profit groups and taxpayers who live out of town should contact the Citizen to be put on the "no charge" mailing list. All other parties may receive the Citizen for a \$30. annual donation.
- The Citizen will be delivered by the 1st of each month (every Ashford mailbox and P.O. box). Copies of the Citizen will also be made available in the Ashford Town
- All submissions must be received by the 15th of each month. Submissions received after the cutoff date for an issue will not be published. No exceptions.
- All items for the Citizen must include the submitter's name, address, and telephone number for verification. Items written on behalf of an organization require the signature of an authorized representative.
- The Citizen reserves the exclusive right to revise or reject all materials submitted for publication. As this publication is a limited purpose publication which is heavily subsidized by Ashford taxpayers in order to provide public information, the following will <u>not</u> be accepted: political ads/articles; opinion letters; religious, or other interest group ads/articles that go beyond an invitation to a program, event or time; explicit/ exploitive, obscene or degrading text, pictures/illustrations; offensive, proselytizing or slanderous articles.



Give the gift of choice and help empower your neighbors in need by donating a gift card for Ashford's "Holiday Wishes" gift card drive.



All Tax Bills that are payable are posted online. The new supplemental motor vehicle tax bills will be available on the website in December 2023 and are available for payment if there is a shopping cart next to it. An **e-check** costs \$.95, the credit card fee is 2.99%. If you use a debit card, you must treat it as a credit card, and the 2.99% fee applies. Minimum fee for credit/debit cards is \$3.95. You can use the system 24/7. You do not need to register, but you need to give an email address in order to obtain a receipt.

During January 2024, the collector and assessor offices will be closed to the public on Fridays in order to process mail, online payments, post any adjustments that are necessary, and continue the completion of the Grand List. All Town Offices are closed on Thursdays and legal holidays including Dec. 25th and Dec. 26th, and Jan. 1st.

Tips for the Holidays

Holidays are the best time to connect with family and friends, but parties and gift giving often creates extra waste. Learn what you can do to keep your holidays as green as possible.

Giving Gifts

- Think green before you shop the holiday sales. Bring your own reusable cloth bag for carrying your purchases, and try to buy items with minimal packaging and/or made with recycled content.
- Wrap gifts in recycled or reused wrapping paper. Also remember to save or recycle your used wrapping paper. Give gifts that don't require much packaging, such as concert tickets or gift certificates.
- Send recycled content greeting cards and remember to recycle any paper cards you receive. You can also try sending electronic greeting cards to reduce paper waste.
- Bake cookies or other goodies and package them in reusable and/or recyclable containers as gifts. Homemade goodies show how much you care and help you avoid packaging waste.
- When gifting flowers, consider buying long-lasting silk flowers, potted plants, or live bushes, shrubs, or trees that can be planted in the spring as gifts.

Green Parties and Events

- If you host a party, set the table with cloth napkins and reusable dishes, glasses, and silverware. Also save and reuse party hats, decorations, and favors.
- After holiday festivities, put leftovers in recyclable containers, and share them with family, friends, or others. Donate untouched leftovers from parties to a local food bank or homeless shelter.
- After parties, fill your dishwasher up completely before running it. You will run fewer cycles, which saves energy.

ASHFORD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

While October was Fire Safety Month, inclusive of Fire Prevention Week, we are now approaching the holidays, from Thanksgiving to New Year's, with all their special fire hazards. From fires sparked by holiday decorations to kitchen fires from unattended cooking, it's the time of year for increased fire calls – and an increase in the number of fire deaths and injuries, and the heartbreak when they involve children.

NFPA fire statistics confirm that during the winter months – and particularly the holiday season – the number of structure fires increases.

Keep the Wreath Red

A visual reminder of fire danger

Now in its third year, our department has duplicated a program entitled "Keep the Wreath Red," originated in 1954 by the Naperville (Illinois) Fire Department and then adopted in 1980 by the Illinois Fire Chiefs Association.

The concept is simple, with "Keep the Wreath Red," our fire station displays a holiday wreath, large enough to be seen by passersby or vehicle traffic and decorated in all red holiday lights. For each fire we are called to, from Thanksgiving to New Years, one white light replaces a red light on the wreath.

What we've found is that our residents will glance over to see if any of the red-light bulbs have changed to white. That action, even if just a fraction of second, subconsciously prompts a reminder to our citizens of our holiday fire safety messages. It's a subtle reminder that fires are always possible during the holidays, and that your fire department will be there if you need us.



Will you help us to 'Keep the Wreath Red'?

From everyone at AVFD, we wish you and your families a safe and healthy holiday season.

The call count for October was 8 Fire/Rescue and 39 EMS. Our fiscal year total is 280.



Greetings to the Ashford Community From Cynthia Ford, Superintendent

Wow, time is going fast. Congratulations to those who prevailed in the most recent elections. I look forward to continuing our collaborative efforts with the town governing body. We all share the same goal, moving Ashford forward in a positive manner while being fiscally responsible. We may not all agree on what degree of fiscal responsibility and where the focus should fall but I believe we can all come together to have those discussions respectfully.

Building Update:

Generator is planned to be delivered at the end of November and the automatic switch has been installed. An architect for the roof replacement project has been selected by the Board of Selectman in collaboration with the Building Committee. We are working with the state on the non-priority grant process which will provide the town with the going reimbursement rate towards the project once completed. Currently that reimbursement rate is 66.79% for general construction in 2024. We will begin working in collaboration with the town in submitting the financial records for reimbursement for our Underground Storage Tank (UST) in the coming months. This project was completed this past summer.

Two times a month during the BOE meetings there is an update to all building projects if you are looking for continuous information around needed updates being completed at the school.

BOE Meetings:

December 7, 2023 and December 21, 2023 are the next regularly scheduled meetings. The second meeting of each month is when the curriculum committee meets. At a prior board meeting, it is decided which school committee will be invited to present a subject or curricular area report to the BOE. The meetings are held at Ashford School in Room 16 or online via Zoom. Please come by and inquire, contact me at the school at 860-429-6419 ext. 365, or email me at: cford@ashfordct.org.

After School Care Program:

This program is going well. Please contact me with any questions. The staff, Caitlyn, Sarah, and Marilynn, work very hard to make the program a success. They thoroughly enjoy working with your children.

Budget Process:

Ashford School Superintendent and Business Manager will be holding a Saturday morning work session for preparing the 2024-2025 school year budget. We want to hear from the public on the wants and needs of the community. This is a great opportunity for those that are unable to attend Thursday evening Board meetings to voice their thoughts. Please join us from 10:00am to 12:00 pm on December 2, 2023. Light refreshments will be provided.

Starting in late December the budget process will be a topic of discussion at the BOE meeting. Please tune in to hear the rich discussion around our students and how to budget for the upcoming year. It is important for everyone to see that this is a collaborative approach with the teachers and all the different departments. We do our best to predict the unknown expenses that may pop up during the school years. The team looks at every line to determine what is needed to maintain and continue to push our students forward into our ever changing complex world. This can be very challenging for small districts because one to two students can affect the bottom line. The budget is developed with the Board of Education goals as the guide and we look at every cost savings opportunity.
