HAPPY NEW YEAR!

May 2024 be a year of good health and happiness for you and yours! I'd also like 2024 to be a new opportunity for all of us to work together for the benefit of our lovely rural town. To that end, I would like to keep you informed of issues, plans, and activities that can affect all of us - and encourage your feedback and involvement.

KEY GOVERNMENT ACTIVITIES - JANUARY:

- Initial 2024-2025 budget and capital improvement planning
- Planning & Zoning Commission review of December IID Zone public survey results and the start of soliciting input from each town agency for use in updating the Town's Plan of Conservation and Development

A CHANGE: Effective January 1, the town will begin charging a \$50 fee for use of Knowlton Memorial Hall, the Senior Center, and the Old Post Office for private parties/events and will donate the money collected to the town's food pantry. A \$50 fully refundable cleaning fee will also be charged to defray any extra cleaning expense. Anyone who reserved one of these 3 locations prior to January 1 for a private event to be held in 2024 is exempt from these charges, as are all entities who are not charged for Ashford Citizen ads today.

AN OPPORTUNITY: A portion of the federal infrastructure money budgeted for deploying dependable high-speed internet service nationwide has been allocated to Connecticut, and a program is being developed by the CT Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) to identify Town Grant Areas eligible for these funds. The program is based on the number of households in town without adequate internet, which is why we need to hear from you if your location has any one of these 3 internet service issues:

- Unserved: Your location has an internet speed below 25 Mbps/3 Mbps.
- Underserved: Your location has an internet speed below 100 Mbps/20 Mbps or DSL (internet through your phone) is the only service offered in your location.
- Expense is too high: You have tried to obtain basic internet service and found that the cost to get connected is too high to afford. You can check your internet speed at https://www.speedtest.net/, then report results by email to firstselectman@ashfordtownhall.org by January 31 to let us know if any you fall under any of the 3 categories.

Winter Weather Safety Tips


Before the storm strikes...

- In case of heat and power loss, have:
 - · A flashlight and extra batteries
 - Battery-powered NOAA weather radio
 - Extra food and water
 - Extra medicine and baby items
 - · First aid supplies
 - Plenty of heating fuel
 - · Emergency heat source
 - · Fire extinguisher and smoke alarm
- In vehicles:
 - Fully check/winterize before winter.
 - Carry a Winter Storm Survival Kit:
 - Mobile phone, charger, batteries
 - Blankets/sleeping bags
 - Flashlight with extra batteries
 - First-aid kit
 - High-calorie, non-perishable food
 - Extra clothing to keep dry
 - Small can and waterproof matches to melt snow for drinking water
 - Shovel
 - Windshield scraper and brush
 - Tool kit
 - Battery booster cables
 - Water container
 - Keep your gas tank near full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines.
 - Avoid traveling alone.
 - Let someone know your travel plan.

If caught in a winter storm...

- If outside, find shelter
 - Try to stay dry, cover exposed skin.
 - If no shelter is available
 - Build a lean-to, windbreak, or snow cave for wind protection.
 - Build a fire for heat and to attract attention.
 - Melt snow for drinking water
 - Don't eat snow-it will lower your body temperature.
- If in a vehicle, stay there
 - Run the motor for about 10 minutes each hour for heat.
 - Make sure the exhaust pipe is not
 - blocked, and open the window slightly to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
 - Turn on dome light when running the engine at night to be visible.





- Close off unneeded rooms
- Stuff towels in cracks under doors.
- Cover windows at night.
- Wear layers of loose-fitting clothing.

January 2023 Conservation Commission News


The Ashford Citizen's Artist – Editha Hayes Spencer (1921-2010) and The Babcock Library Conservation Bookshelf

The Ashford Conservation Commission was founded in 1972 and had 8 members: Addison Bassett, Rodney Kreger, William Madsen, Catherine Placek, George Quint, John Rankin, David Schroeder and Editha Spencer. In 1974 they decided to individually donate books to create a conservation book collection for the Babcock Library. Editha Spencer was asked to create a special bookplate just for these books, and 500 copies of the bookplate were to be ordered in 1974. The first donations were to be made by Conservation Commission members

According to the Commission's reports, the librarian in 1976, decided not to continue this collection; her reason was the time involved. Since Editha Spencer designed this special bookplate – did the Babcock Library have a copy forty-seven years later? After recent conversations with our new Library Director and librarian, Ann Harper, about this special Conservation Bookshelf and the bookplate, she magically was able to locate the bookplate inside Edwin Way Teale's 1959 publication *Adventures in Nature, selections from the outdoor writings of Ewin Way Teale*. This specific book was a gift of the D.B. Schroeders, David and Jill, on 4/17/74.

Dr. David B. Schroeder was a beloved professor of dendrology in the Plant Science Dept at UConn, beginning his career there in 1965. He ended his tenure there 41 years later also having served as head of the Dept. of Natural Resources Management and Engineering. The Schroeders lived in Ashford many years before moving to Woodstock Valley for their later years together. According to his obituary, "Doc Schroeder" was also a founding member of the Eastern Conn. Forest Landowners Assoc., chairman of the Ashford Inland Wetlands Commission, chairman of the Wolf Den Land Trust and the UConn representative on the Connecticut Licensed Arborist Examining Board. The Schroeders' choice of the Teale volume on nature writings was probably meaningful to a man who loved to tell stories himself and a way to further honor Teale, a classic environmentalist.

The bookplate itself depicts the Ashford Oak tree standing tall and strong on firm earth with possibly a bright sunrise or sunset silhouetting its branches. In 1974 this tree was considered the second largest red oak in the United States according to Richard Schimmelpfeng, a UConn Librarian, bookplate



collector and friend of the Spencers. The remnants of the tree are still standing today although greatly diminished. Editha's typical "ES" hallmark, seen on her other wood or linoleum cuts, is in the lower right.



So when she moves to a new town and finally makes a real friend, she can't help but feel good about the attention her friend's older brother, Wren, immediately gives her. He lavishes her with compliments and attention—and so what if he's 25-years-old and she can't tell anyone about him? At least she's no longer an outsider. But as Naomi gets lulled into the intoxication of Wren's attention, she fails to see how easy it is to lose her newfound sense of normalcy in all the lies. Now she must fight to maintain her secret at the same time she juggles hardship after hardship before she loses not only Wren, but herself, too.

Your Car:

Check your tires and assure they have proper air.

Fill your fuel tank.

Essential supplies – Extra socks, hats, gloves, snacks, flashlight, flares, shovel, kitty litter or sand, and a blanket.

First aid kit

Ice scraper/snow brush

Jumper Cables

Phone charger

Pocket knife or multi-tool

Snow shovel

Tow rope

If an emergency arises, you can help us by clearing snow and treating walkways with sand/salt and make sure your house number is cleared of snow so we can find you.

Assessment News

2022 SUPPLEMENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE BILLS

Supplemental motor vehicles are vehicles which were newly registered after October 1, 2022 and prior to August 1, 2023. The assessments are prorated from the month registered through July 2023.

If you receive a supplemental bill and disposed of that vehicle prior to September 1, 2023 your tax bill may be eligible for a credit, if you provide **Proof of Disposal** to the Assessor. It's best to provide proof prior to paying your taxes.

Credits and all other changes to motor vehicle assessment and taxes will only be processed on Fridays during the month of January, when the Tax Collection and Assessment offices will be closed to the public. The new assessment and tax due will be available in the online lookup on Saturdays.

To receive a credit, you must provide:

- 1) proof of what happened to the vehicle (i.e., Proof of Disposal) and
- 2) a returned plate receipt from the CT DMV. A PLATE RECEIPT ALONE IS INSUFFICIENT
- <u>1.</u> <u>Proof of Disposal</u> depends on what happened to the vehicle. All documents should include the vehicle's VIN and a date.
 - i. Registered in another state: proof is a copy of the registration in that state showing the initial date of registration.
 - ii. Sold: proof is a dated bill of sale
 - iii. Total loss: proof includes a letter from the insurance company indicating the date of loss or a receipt from person hauling the vehicle away for the insurance company.
 - iv. Repossession: proof is a letter or notice from the repossessing company indicating the vehicle's date of repossession.
 - v. Junked: proof is a receipt from the hauler or junk yard.
 - vi. Traded-in: proof is the bill of sale or invoice for the new vehicle showing the car being valued in trade.
 - vii. Stolen: proof is a copy of the police report.



THE DEADLINE TO RECEIVE A CREDIT FOR A VEHICLE ON THE 2022 GRAND LIST IS 12/31/2024.



All Tax Bills that are payable are posted online. The new supplemental motor vehicle tax bills are available on the website as of December 13, 2023 and are available for payment if there is a shopping cart next to it. An **e-check** costs \$.95, the credit card fee is 2.99%. If you use a debit card, you must treat it as a credit card, and the 2.99% fee applies. Minimum fee for credit/debit cards is \$3.95. You can use the system 24/7. You do not need to register, but you need to give an email address in order to obtain a receipt.

During January 2024, the collector and assessor offices will be **closed** to the public on **Fridays** in order to process mail, online payments, post any adjustments that are necessary, and continue the completion of the Grand List. All Town Offices are closed on Thursdays and legal holidays including Jan. 1st and Jan. 15th.
